	Note to administrator: If a student fails to perform satisfac- torily on a grade 3, 5, or 8 math or reading assessment, the law allows a parent or guardian to make a request for the student to be assigned to a particular classroom teacher in the applicable subject area for the subsequent school year by following the established process of the District. The Dis- trict is not required to grant the request. To better manage staffing and scheduling in advance of the start of the school year, consider offering parents and guardians the oppor- tunity to request a different teacher over the summer.
Teacher Request	If a student has failed to perform satisfactorily on the grade 3, 5, or 8 math or reading assessment, the parent or guardian may request a particular classroom teacher for the next school year for the ap- plicable subject area, if more than one classroom teacher is availa- ble in that area. The District is not required to grant the request.
	If there is only one classroom teacher per grade level, then the Dis- trict will not be able to grant the request and the parent may resub- mit a request when circumstances change.
	Requests must be in writing and submitted to the campus principal by June 30 th to be considered.
	The following information should be in the request:
	Student's name
	Campus attended
	• Identification of the assessment with the grade level and subject in which the student failed to perform satisfactorily
	Requested classroom teacher by name and subject area
	Qualities requested in a teacher
	 Parent or guardian's name, address, phone number, and email address
	If the request is granted, the parent or guardian will be notified by August 1 st by the campus principal or designee.
