Dear Center Families,

Center School District is partnering with the Kansas City Health Department to host onsite COVID-19 vaccine clinics for Center School District families. Child doses will be available for students aged 5-11 years and full doses available for those aged 12 years and up. Boosters will be available for eligible adults including CSD Staff, Parents/Families, and community members, aged 18 and up. The Health Department will operate the clinics with organizational-only assistance from CSD nurses and staff. Those attending the clinic will receive the Pfizer vaccine.

Currently, COVID-19 vaccinations are 100% voluntary. Fully vaccinated individuals (defined as those who are 2 weeks after their second dose in a 2-dose series, such as the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines, or 2 weeks after a single-dose vaccine, such as Johnson & Johnson’s Janssen vaccine) are not required to quarantine after an exposure if they are asymptomatic. This means COVID-19 vaccines play a crucial role in limiting quarantines and keeping students in school.

Pfizer Vaccine

The vaccine is approved for those five years old and older. On Nov. 2, the CDC approved the Pfizer pediatric vaccine for children ages five to 11 years old. In May, the vaccine was approved for those 12-15.

The pediatric Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine is one-third the dosage given to teens and adults.

As it is for adults and children 12 and older, it will still require two shots at least three weeks apart to get the maximum protection of the vaccine. Pfizer booster doses are recommended at least six months after your second shot for those 18 and over.
