On Tuesday, October 26, AHS will administer the Pre-ACT exam and PSAT exam. Students in grades 9-11 will be dismissed at 1:00pm on Tuesday, October 26. Bus transportation will be provided. Seniors will not attend school on this day. Below are specifics for each grade level.

9th grade: Students will take the Pre-ACT, which is a practice for the ACT, a college admissions test, a very useful career and skills interest inventory. Guidance counselors utilize the Pre-ACT to help students consider career options and to measure college readiness.

10th grade: Students will take the PSAT. The PSAT is not only a measure for college readiness, but is a practice SAT, which all juniors in Indiana will take in the spring of the 11th grade year. PSAT scores are also used for course placement and help us evaluate student progress and inform our core instruction.

11th grade: Students will take the PSAT. The scores from the PSAT may qualify 11th graders for the National Merit Scholarship Competition (NMSC) where they can earn National Merit Commended, Semifinalist, or Finalist recognition as well as become eligible for numerous scholarships.

It is also the final practice before taking the SAT in March, 2022. All juniors in Indiana will take the SAT at that time.

12th grade: Students will not attend school on this day. We encourage you to plan college visits, military recruitment meetings, or even a job shadow. You may continue researching colleges and completing college or scholarship application. You might also take care of any doctor appointments, etc. if possible. Please take advantage of October 26 to accomplish something for your senior year and beyond.

Our Guidance Counselors have had a busy start to the 2021-2022 school year! Grades 9-11 counselors are meeting one-on-one with freshmen to touch base as the students begin their high school career. Counselors visited the freshman PCC classes in September to discuss post-secondary options. They will visit the classes again in November and December to present information about Graduation Pathways requirements and to talk about academic plans for the four years at AHS. The counselors also visited sophomore SRTs at the beginning of the year with information about upcoming practice college entrance exams and college & career planning.

In late August, the senior counselors met with grade 12 English classes to give information about applying for colleges. Due dates, application tips, and how to send high school transcripts were discussed. Seniors received their orange FAFSA/Financial Aid folders in SRT class at the end of September. The senior counselors are continuing with individual meetings with all of their students. Make sure your senior checks the "Class of 2022 Guidance Group" in Schoology often for updates on scholarship and career opportunities.



FAFSA Day

FAFSA Day for Avon High School senior parents is from 1:00-7:00pm on November 9th in the ALC Lecture Hall (enter door 13). Parents of seniors can get individualized help completing their FAFSA. The <u>Free Application for Federal Student Aid</u>, or FAFSA, is the form that determines financial aid from the government and most colleges. The form collects personal and financial information from students and parents, and applies a formula to determine the Expected Family Contribution.








Attendance

If your child misses school or is late for any reason, call the Attendance line, (317) 544-5000, option #1. You may call this line 24 hours a day.

Students will be marked 'unverified' (unexcused) without a call from a parent.

If your student was marked unverified in a class for the day, you will receive an automated call that evening. An unverified absence means we have not received a phone call from a parent/guardian about the absence. If you receive this phone call and feel it is in error, please have your student talk with the teacher who marked the absence or you can contact the teacher via email. If the absence needs to be marked differently, the teacher will contact the Attendance Office to make the change.

Early Dismissals

Occasionally, students may need to be dismissed early from school. Please email early dismissal information to <u>AHSStudentServices@avon-schools.org</u>. Please include student name, grade, time student is to be dismissed and reason for dismissal. Or, you may call Student Services at 317-544-5000 ext. 5200 and leave a message with all of the aforementioned information. We will deliver the early dismissal pass to the student before dismissal time.



Bus Passes

We will not be providing bus passes for the 2021-2022 school year.



Immunizations

The Indiana State Department of Health sets the immunization requirements for students attending public schools in Indiana. For the 2021-2022 school year, all students in grades K-12 will be required to have 2 appropriately spaced doses of Hepatitis A vaccine. Contact your health care provider to ask what vaccines your child may need. Low-cost immunizations are available at the Hendricks County Health Department at (317) 745-9222.

On Thursday, November 4, students who have not yet provided proper immunization documentation will be excluded from school until proper documentation is received by the school nurse. A second dose of Meningitis is required for seniors.
