Among these students, a total of 142 out of 173 enrolled students (82%) were American Indian, with Menominee Indian Tribe having the highest representation. 58% percent of CMN's students in the fall were aged 25 or older. Among the youngest enrollees were 20 high school students participating in grant-funded classes through Learn and Earn.
