

There are lots of great unplugged activities to do that help students learn about coding and computer science.







Greetings Glen Hills Families,

As we continue to move through educating scholars in a pandemic and after almost a full year of virtual learning, we continue to monitor and adjust to meet their needs. After fielding concerns from teachers, scholars, and families about scholars feeling under pressure with academic demands we investigated our practices through stakeholder surveys around homework in conjunction with our most recent STAR data in Mathematics and Reading. The results of this work, which are outlined below, have led to a streamlining of homework practices to seek to limit the homework load while continuing to address clear areas of academic need.



Masks

In response to the data, Glen Hills has begun a partnership with ALEKS, a research-based, online learning program. The goal of this partnership is to streamline homework in mathematics to build needed skills in a way that is personalized to each of our scholars. ALEKS is an adaptive program, so it will recognize skills your scholar has already mastered as well as skills they need to further develop in mathematics. The program includes learning resources for scholars, such as video tutorials, links to math vocabulary, and a messaging system to your scholar's math teacher. The ALEKS program encourages strong math practices, such as taking notes and working problems out with paper and pencil. The district is providing composition notebooks for students to use while working in ALEKS.

Scholars will need to spend at least 2 hours per week working with ALEKS outside of the classroom as part of their homework routine. ALEKS will be your scholar's only math homework, and their work in ALEKS will be monitored by their math teacher and graded as homework. Scholars will continue their grade-level math learning during class time with the Bridges or Illustrative Mathematics curriculum in school.

Scholar login information will be provided to you by your scholar's math teacher. There is no separate parent login in. If you want to see how your scholar is progressing in ALEKS, login with your scholar and view their reports. Here is an informational video for scholars and their families: <u>Video Link</u>.

Teachers in all other subject areas will coordinate their efforts to ensure that scholars have no more than 30 minutes of cumulative work in all other subject areas to limit the homework load to one hour per evening. Additionally, the focus of all work outside of mathematics should be focused on this work should be focused on reading, writing, language development or presentation skills.
