Introduction	This document is an update to Stonyhurst's previous Covid-19 Risk Assessments. It is an interim update to cover the period 10 th December until 10 th January. A more comprehensive RA document will be provided prior to the start of the new term. It will be distributed to staff and published on the Stonyhurst Website. The information provided now is based on the Government briefing of December 8 th when the Prime Minister announced further restrictions in England due to current concerns about the emerging Omicron Variant of Covid-19. Previous Covid-19 Risk Assessments	Throughout the pandemic Stonyhurst has been committed to Covid-security. An archived list of all previous Covid-19 documentation can be found on the Covid Information page of the Stonyhurst Website Covid-19 Information Stonyhurst
Current Contextualisation	Over the past few weeks there has been growing concern internationally about the emergence of a new variant of Covid-19, which has been given the name Omicron. Whilst there remains significant uncertainty about Omicron in terms of the seriousness of the illness caused and its ability to evade the current vaccines, there is evidence that it spreads more rapidly than previous variants, including Delta. Concern about the transmission rate of Omicron has prompted the UK Government to introduce some further restrictions in England to try and slow the spread of the new variant. The restrictions form part of the Government's pandemic strategy and sit alongside the recently updated information in relation to the Covid-19 Vaccination programme and the changes to Travel rules. At Stonyhurst	Stonyhurst will continue to comply with all Covid-19 legislation and be mindful of all guidance from the Government and other relevant expert bodies. Updated guidance for schools can be found at Schools COVID-19 operational guidance (publishing.service.gov.uk) An email sent on December 7 th by the Bursar to all staff provided guidance for colleagues who will be on campus outside the school term. However, following the Government announcement on December 8 th , it is now necessary to provide colleagues with a further update as detailed on page 2. It is important as we continue to face the challenges of Covid-19 that we all do everything we can to keep ourselves and each other safe.

Changes across England following the December 8 th announcement by the Prime Minister	 From Friday December 10th, face coverings will be required by law in most indoor settings. Keeping each other safe at Stonyhurst	We are grateful to colleagues for their on-going efforts to keep Stonyhurst as safe as possible for everyone.
	In the face of the potential increased infection risks posed by Omicron, please could we respectfully ask all members of the Stonyhurst Community to continue to follow Covid-secure protocols. These include:
	Be alert to the risks posed by Covid-19 to yourself and to others
	Do not come onto Campus if you have any Covid symptoms, or have a positive LFT or PCR result, or have been told by Test & Trace to self-isolate
	Take regular LF Tests prior to coming onto Campus
	If bringing visitors onto Campus, please observe and comply with the Covid-19 Visitor Protocol
	Maintain excellent hand and respiratory hygiene
	Where possible limit close social contact and practice social distancing whilst on Campus
	Consider holding meetings on Teams or Zoom
	When meeting in person on Campus try to use spaces with good ventilation
	Wear a face-covering in any indoor area on Campus where social distancing is not possible or where there is limited ventilation
	Where you can, with the agreement of your Line Manager, work from home
	• Respect that colleagues may have different views of Covid-risk and be mindful of the needs of those who may be more vulnerable to serious complications from Covid
	Comply with all Government legislation including in relation to testing, self-isolation, and travel
Summing-up	Covid-19 continues to present a global challenge.
	There is currently significant uncertainty about the impact of the new Omicron Variant. The Government may make further announcements during the next few weeks.
	It is a fast-moving situation and Stonyhurst will continue to monitor the situation closely and will provide a further update in January.
