Inside Our Classrooms

On Friday 12th November some members of the Local Board visited Blackthorns to conduct Learning Walks. This was a really positive and engaging morning and we would like to share some of the observations from our report noted during our visit:

- It was helpful to see how the school's values, class charter (produced annually by each class), behaviour framework and information around the Zones of Regulation were displayed in an age appropriate way in each class and to hear how they all work together to provide a coherent framework for pupils and staff.
- We also saw how the children moved between classrooms and play/going to assembly. The overall atmosphere was one of happiness, vibrancy and ease with their environment.
- The immersive learning environment which has been created to support pupil's learning journey is really engaging and positive.
- Classrooms are used to create a learning environment from the decoration of outside wall and door to reflect the learning theme, to the creative use of the walls within to share the learning process as well as celebrating children's achievements.
- Engagement in lessons is high with children being keen to answer questions and share their thoughts
- Children showed real confidence when speaking to us and answering questions.
- It is evident that children's ideas and suggestions are not only listened to but also implemented

We spoke to pupils and heard that:

- There was universal comfort, and in some cases delight, at being able to return to school following lockdown, though several confessed to being anxious beforehand.
- All pupils voiced positive views of attending school, and the concept of not attending for reasons other than illness was alien.
- Covid had been unsettling for the children and they spoke of how it had impacted them. However pupils did not express any concerns about having fallen behind in schooling, and talked more around the emotional impact of returning to school. They all spoke about using the "Zones of Regulation" and this was clearly providing a common way of expressing and understanding state of mind to all the children we spoke to. In discussions with Year 6 it was good to see how their use of core values and behaviours had become embedded and something that they can internally draw upon. Sense of self understanding and self regulation. The positives of this approach were very evident to see.
- All children we spoke to expressed how safe and happy they felt at Blackthorns. It was amazing to see how able even the youngest children were to articulate and understand their emotions. Through the well embedded zones of regulation they were aware of the tools available to them to self regulate and had a good appreciation of what worked well for them individually. They also expressed how it helped them to understand how their classmates were feeling and also how helpful they found it in being able to express to teachers where they were emotionally at any point.
- We heard about a pupil initiative which has been rolled out across the school, a worry box. This allowed pupils
 to express their concerns anonymously. These were then read by the class teacher who would take the appropriate action. All the pupils were comfortable that any anxieties or troubles they had would be adequately
 dealt with.
- All pupils were positive about the school experience and expressed real pride in attending Blackthorns.

The overall atmosphere was incredibly positive. Children were relaxed, confident and took so much pleasure in sharing their experiences with us. The school ethos was live and evident across the school with all children being clear on the core values and the behaviours expected of them but in a way that was personal and relevant to them as individuals. This was backed up by the clear displays of values, classroom charters, wellbeing information and zones of regulation in each classroom visited. The pride and sense of belonging to their school community from both pupils and staff was awe-inspiring. We look forward to visiting again next term. Julie Keylock [Chair of Looal Board]

Offering an extra performance meant parents got a better view and each class got their opportunity to shine...and we all got the extra treat of another show. Well done to all, and thank you to the whole community for your support.
