UNIT #1: BACK TO SCHOOL (1 ½ WEEKS)

ESSENTIAL QUESTION: What does it mean to belong?

UNIT SUMMARY:

In this unit, students will solidify routines and expectations for their classroom. They'll learn how to be an active listener, responsible member of the class, and respectful contributor to conversations. Students will explore writing in several different genres, and will read traditional literature from several different cultures in order to examine the similarities and differences. The class will also focus on what it means to belong to a classroom community, helping everyone feel like a valued member.

ESSENTIAL UNDERSTANDINGS:

A community of readers helps to support one another as they become stronger readers. A foundation of trust and respect is crucial to creating a community of readers who can build each other up throughout the year. Building independent reading stamina, structured routines, and collaborative expectations will help students grow as readers.
