Families can call their nearest participating recreation center to confirm hours of service. The meals are only for children and teenagers up to 18 years old and must be eaten on-site.

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# **New COVID Testing Protocol**

Our new improve COVID-19 testing process, Operation Expanded Testing, will launch on 01/04/2022. This program is supported and funded through the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services to provide COVID-19 PCR testing to K-12 schools at no cost to the school. With this new and improved program, we hope to continue preventing the spread of COVID-19 while keeping more students and employees in school. A key benefit of this program is that members of presumptive positive and inconclusive pools are automatically retested and the positive individual(s) are identified and isolated immediately. This means that presumptive positive pools will no longer need to quarantine or seek individual follow-up testing to return to school.

- 1) Register for the new program
  - The online registration process takes less than 5 minutes. <u>Please use this link which takes you to a platform called Assure.</u>
  - For a short video guide on "how to" complete the registration/consent process on this platform, please watch <u>this video.</u>
    - High School Parents/Students: On the Find Your Institution page, enter 5501
       Cedar Avenue Philadelphia, PA 19143 into the Search Location field..
    - Each student should be registered separately.

# 2) Additional Program Information:

- This new program combines pooled and individual testing into one efficient process, using two different swabs per student.
- How it Works:
  - The student or the adult conducting the collection (if student is under 12 years old) will swab both nostrils using the first swab. This first swab goes into the pool, or group, to be tested.
  - Next, the student or adult will swab both nostrils again using the second swab.
    This second swab goes into an individual container. The individual swab is
    only tested if the lab believes there may be COVID-19 present in the pooled
    test.
  - If your student is part of a pool that does not detect COVID-19, then you will not get an individual result (but the school will be notified that the pool sample was negative).
  - If there is a risk that someone in the pool has COVID-19, every swab in the pool will be processed individually, and you will get an individual result posted in the Assure platform.
  - You can set up your account preferences in Assure to send you a text message
    or an email when a new result is available. The school will also be monitoring
    results for all students and employees and issuing isolation and quarantine
    notification as needed.

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# Student Attendance & COVID-19 Cases

#### Arriving on Time

Learners are late if they arrive after 8:03AM. It is imperative that students arrive before 8AM so they can get to class on time. Families will begin receiving automated messages when your child reports to school late or if they are absent. You can always see your child's attendance on PowerSchool.

# Covid-19 and Quarantining Absences

If a student is required to quarantine due to COVID-19 exposure the student will be marked AEMD Absent Medical: This excused absence code is to be used when a student is absent for medical purposes.

# Face Mask
