Their dedication, hard work and teamwork brought our school District the first ever PIAA 6A State Championship back from Hershey! As we close out our year and head into 2022, I have been reflective on the milestones both educationally and otherwise, in 2021. Just this school year, we were able to fully vaccinate roughly half of our elementary student population and offer booster vaccines to all faculty and staff, here within our building.

We have led the way by being one of the first school Districts in the Commonwealth to implement pool testing in all ten of our buildings, preventing the potential spread from unknowing asymptomatic individuals.
