Our school is accredited through DESE via an Annual Performance Report. The data exhibited within the APR document provides evidence of a high-quality curriculum supported by research based instructional strategies. Within Park Hill, at the elementary level, instructional coaches and curriculum writers collaborate to develop a curriculum that is high-quality and aligned to the Missouri Learning Standards. At Southeast, teachers and teams are expected to follow this curriculum and collaborate to meet the needs of their students. Teachers are evaluated regularly to ensure they are following the district curriculum using the NEE teacher evaluation system, walk-throughs, and collaborative professional development sessions.

Parents receive guarterly grade cards and progress reports mid-way through each guarter. Parents can communicate with their child's teacher as often as needed and information is provided in weekly classroom newsletters about the

curriculum, what students are learning in the classroom, and how parents can support learning at home. Information is available online about the curriculum and state standards. The building principal disseminates information to staff using weekly staff newsletters, a teacher handbook, staff meetings, collaborative professional development sessions, and reminder emails.

Materials are provided throughout the year to help parents support their children's learning. This is done through parent orientation at the beginning of the year, Parent/Teacher Conferences, and classroom newsletters. The Reading Interventionists provide reading strategy materials to students to assist parents in using these materials at home. ELD teachers and Reading Interventionists deliver materials during porch home visits complying with COVID safety guidelines. If parents need additional resources and materials, classroom teachers, Reading Interventionists, and ELD teachers provide the materials as requested.

It is an expectation that classroom teachers and staff communicate with parents and provide support as needed. This can be done through a variety of ways, and teachers work to understand the best way to communicate with each family (phone call, email, virtual avenues such as Seesaw, Schoology, and Zoom). All classroom teachers send home a weekly communication via a classroom newsletter. Teachers also make one positive parent contact, per semester, for each student in their class. This is documented each semester on a log sheet and is submitted to the principal. Parents are invited to participate in two parent-teacher conferences annually, as well as attend Family Nights and other events. Professional Development is provided to staff regarding parent communication and engagement. District reading interventionists and ELD teachers are continuing to participate in book studies to enhance communication with the following books. This has been ongoing throughout the 2020-2021 school year and will continue during the 2021-2022 school year.

Information is made available to parents about the school and other community resources through meet the teacher night and parent orientation. Resource checklists are provided to all students and specific students throughout the year. Parents are encouraged and invited to volunteer at the school and to participate in various family evenings. Additionally, each spring Southeast hosts a school and community resource night in which families are invited to visit each booth and learn more about resources available to them. Due to COVID safety guidelines, parents/guidelines and non student family members have not been allowed to enter our building this year. When safety and district guidelines allow, we plan to resume in person volunteering and school/community resource night. Our school social worker works with individual families to ensure supports and resources are in place and to connect families with other resources they may need. Porch visits are conducted by our ELD teachers and Reading Interventionist to ensure that families understand supports, resources, and information. In the spring, we host a student showcase in which students highlight their learning from the year to parents through different learning activities they have done while explaining what they have learned. Teachers are available to provide additional information and supports for extending learning at home as needed and when requested.
