

# **Northwest ISD and Redistricting 2021**


Governor Greg Abbott signed Texas' new redistricting maps into law on October 25, 2021. Following a delay in the release of the 2020 census data due to the COVID pandemic, the bills were approved during the third special session of the 87th Legislature. Congressional and state legislative district lines are redrawn every decade following the United States census. Lawsuits over the maps have been filed, but it is anticipated that the new maps will take effect for the 2022 elections. Following is an approximate illustration of the changes in relation to Northwest ISD.




## **US Congressional Map**

Three US Congressional districts continue to cover Northwest ISD following redistricting changes. District 26 (Burgess) expands into Wise County and now includes all NISD portions of Denton and Wise counties. District 24 (Van Duyne) expands from a small Southlake area to cover everything East of I-35 in the Tarrant County portion of the district. District 12 (Granger) no longer covers Wise County and represents the majority of Tarrant County West of I-35.






### **Texas Senate Map**

Northwest ISD now has only two senate district representatives instead of three. Following the changes made during redistricting, District 30 (Springer) is no longer in the NISD boundaries. District 12 (Nelson) expands to cover all portions of Denton and Wise counties in NISD. District 9 (Hancock) now covers the entire Tarrant County portion of the district.






### **Texas House Map**

Northwest ISD gains two districts on the House side, increasing from five to seven representatives. District 63 (Parker) is now represented by Districts 57, 65, and 63. District 93 (Krause) extends East, covering Bus. Hwy 287 to FM 377 in Tarrant County. District 98 (Capriglione) is now a small corner East of FM 377 in Tarrant County. District 61 (King) and District 99 (Geren) remains unchanged.


