STUDENT ID's

- School Board policy requires that students wear a Joliet student ID in an approved clear holder and lanyard around your neck.
 - Not on backpacks
 - Not held in hand
 - Not hanging out of pockets

OIf you don't have your student ID you will be issued a temporary ID

•You must have your ID to ride school district buses and to enter all JTHS events (games, dances, etc.)

Face Mask

- Face mask must be worn upon entering the building.
- Mask is expected to be worn at all times.
- You must wear your mask to ride school district buses and to enter all JTHS events (games, dances, etc.)
- Not wearing a mask will not be tolerated and will result in a 1 day out of school suspension

<u>Weapons</u>

Weapon (Object Construed to be a Weapon)

Possession of ammunition or a weapon or the use of any object as a weapon at school or at school-sponsored activities. A weapon is defined as an instrument of combat and includes, but is not limited to, guns, knives, bludgeons, nunchuks, bows and arrows, metal knuckles, pepper spray/mace, stun gun, taser and any other devices or objects listed as weapons in the Illinois Compiled Statutes Chapter 720.

Possession of any object that can be construed to be a weapon or is used as a weapon at school or at schoolsponsored activities. The term "weapon" may be defined by reference to either federal, state or local law.



• A weapon is anything that can cause serious bodily harm. This can be as small as a keychain knife/box cutter, or as large as a bowie knife.

This includes homemade weapons and firearms/look alike firearms

• Could be recommended for expulsion and arrested.



- Mace
 - Mace is considered a weapon in the state of Illinois. It is not allowed to be brought into the school building or carried on school grounds.
 - Students can be expelled for being in possession of mace.



Doors

- There are over 25 doors at Joliet West.
- In the morning, students may enter Door 1, Door 5, Door 6, or Door 13.
- At dismissal, you can use the exits around the building.
- Do not prop doors open or open doors for anyone!

After School

- All students must be in an assigned area or out of the school building.
- If you are **not** involved in an activity, you are **not** allowed in the building.
- Students waiting for a ride, should wait at the designated area.
- You may not leave school grounds and come back to ride Activity Bus.

Student Attire/Dress Code

Student Handbook:

 All students are expected to be covered from shoulder to mid-thigh. Clothing must be clean and neat. Garments will have the appropriate length hem and shorts will be of appropriate length. Pants, shorts, etc. must be worn at the waist. Students must wear footwear.



FALSE ALARMS/THREATS/WEAPONS

- Any threat made toward this building may result in an automatic expulsion for two years and police arrest.
- Any weapon brought into this building may result in 1-10 days out of school suspension with Behavior Warning or Expulsion Recommendation and possible Police Arrest.
- Being in possession of pepper spray will result in a one day out of school suspension and possible Police Arrest.
 - Spraying pepper spray intentionally at someone may result in expulsion from school and Police Arrest.



BULLYING, HARASSMENT, INTIMIDATION

- Bullying, Harassment and Intimidation is not tolerated at JTHS
