MISSION/VISION


The mission of Felicitas Mendez International School is to foster social, emotional and educational growth in both English and Spanish through collaborative partnerships, a rigorous academic environment and an inclusive community. Our vision is to empower bilingual, biliterate and multicultural life-long learners, leaving no students below grade level in their native language and no students below grade level in math. We are devoted to making every minute at school count toward reaching our academic goals.

CULTURAL ENRICHMENT THROUGH DUAL LANGUAGE

Research shows that bilingual children who are educated in their second language outperform students who speak and learn only in their native language. Students at Felicitas Mendez go beyond learning another language to learn about other cultures. Students learn to read first in their dominant language, then they spend equal amounts of time building literacy in English and Spanish. Math is taught in English, while science and social studies are taught in Spanish. Students build fluency in both languages through their daily interactions with peers and teachers.

FOCUS ON RESEARCH

Felicitas Mendez International School's unique learning model incorporates research projects and fact finding into every student's daily curriculum. Even at the Pre-K level, students research and present basic information to their parents to teach them the importance of the practice. Older students complete more advanced projects, such as researching the proper composite materials needed to build a sturdy plane. These tasks are assigned as group projects, so students gain experience with working in bilingual pairs throughout their time at school.

STEM PROGRAMMING

Thanks to the support of the Cal Ripken, Sr. Foundation and Devon Energy, every elementary school has a new STEM center where students can participate in fun and engaging hands-on learning activities - including computer coding!
