BUILDING RELATIONSHIPS AND COMMUNITY


We want our students to have the support they need to be their best selves every day. Our students start the day with community circles where students and teachers come together to build strong, trusting relationships that

Students have those opportunities in each class, in art, music. and physical education, in clubs and extracurricular opportunities, and in STEAM projects and maker space activities in the classroom and in the library. As a result, students learn self-control and self-discipline, and are inspired to work out of joy, curiosity, and a love of learning. A child-centered environment focuses on creating lifelong learners and self-motivated adults that realize their vision for their own life and enrich the lives of others.
