Autumn Careers Events at The Burgess Hill Academy

The Autumn term has been a busy one for the Careers Department. We held Post 16 Evening for year 11 parents/carers and students with 27 post-16 colleges and apprenticeship providers in attendance. We have also had post 16 provision assemblies from all the local colleges and sixth forms. All year 11 students have received a one-to-one interview with our Careers Adviser, Kate Beecham and we are now busy supporting them to make their college applications.

Year 8 students received an assembly from the companies responsible for the construction/engineering works on the Northern Arc site. Hearing about the different ways that people can enter engineering.

Thirty-five year 9 students participated in BIMA Digital Day, which is a national competition aimed at raising awareness of digital careers. We were so fortunate that the agency we were partnered with, Tommy in London were able to send 6 volunteers (pictured below) to help our students develop their ideas to raise awareness of climate change looking specifically at the challenges the WWF charity face. Congratulations to our winning group, Pamboo comprising Isaac, Bob, Brooke, Kacey, Luca who have now been entered in the national challenge.





The whole of year 9 received an assembly from HHJ Sarah Venn, Civil Circuit Judge. Sarah explained the process of a court case and her career path to being a Civil Circuit Judge. Year 9 students had the opportunity to try on her robes and participate in mock trials. Sarah encouraged students to think about the cases she presented and decide upon a result. This was a fantastic opportunity for our students as this presentation supported learning about the law in Citizenship lessons.





We started the careers learning journey with the whole of year 7 participating in the University Game which is run by the Outreach department of the University of Brighton. This is a fun way of investigating University life whilst playing a board game. Six student ambassadors from the University came into the Academy over two days to help groups of year 7 students play the game and answer questions. Year 7 were a fantastic year group to work with, intelligent questions, well behaved and so engaged.



As part of the Speakers for Schools programme, Year 10 were very lucky to receive a presentation from Martin Houghton-Brown, CEO of St Johns Ambulance. Martin spoke eloquently on mental health, the impact that the pandemic has had on this and his personal journey with his mental health based around his sexuality. Martin also talked about the work that St Johns Ambulance does and his career path to CEO. As part of this session, Year 10 students were tasked to become journalists in their tutor time and research Martin. Their research was then the basis for questions that were asked during the presentation.


This years's theme is COLOURS OF NATURE

Network Rail have shared important information about works being undertaken in February 2022

Significant works which take place in February next year. They will close the railway between Three Bridges & Brighton and between Three Bridges & Lewes.

From Saturday 19 February to Sunday 27 February 2022 Network Rail engineers will renew a major junction near Haywards Heath, replace track at Burgess Hill and they will build a new underpass providing safe access under the railway at Hassocks.

Network Rail, Southern and Thameslink are working on plans for alternative travel arrangements, including rail replacement buses, and these will be available nearer the time.


Half term

The work will coincide with West Sussex county school's half term. Unfortunately, the school half term for both Brighton & Hove and East Sussex runs from 14-18 February 2022, the week before the closure, so schools in these areas will be open during the works.

We appreciate that this will mean that parents, students and staff who use the rail service during term time may need to make alternative arrangements during these works. We wanted to provide this information to you in advance and ask if you would be able to share it through your communication channels.

The map below shows the lines which will be closed to trains.

Doing the work over the West Sussex half term helps ensure that there are adequate numbers of buses available for the rail replacement bus service as many of these same buses are used in the county to move school children during term time.



Background

The Brighton Main Line is among the most complex and congested routes in the country and the infrastructure on the line is also some of the oldest and most intensively used. This major project has been planned in an efficient way to deliver long-term reliability improvements for passengers who use the line. Network Rail continually reviews work to minimise passenger disruption and keep the railway running as much as possible. By doing this vital work over a nine-day closure, it can be done more quickly with less overall disruption to passengers, and it will deliver more improvement work than using the traditional approach of weekend working.
