Available for students graduating from Carmel (IN) High School in 2023



Carmel Education Foundation (CEF) is pleased to award the following scholarships in May, 2023. Each scholarship is generously funded either by a family, organization, or CEF. Scholarships are available for students attending a college, university, trade school or certification program.

It is recommended that you identify which scholarships you qualify for prior to the application, so that you are prepared to respond to any relevant questions (i.e. club participation, service organizations, etc.). Some scholarships require a short essay and the question is included in this document.

Every scholarship has unique criteria. General categories are listed below, by color, for your reference. If a scholarship has criteria in multiple categories, there is a color bar to the right indicating this.

As an applicant, you will create an account in Kaleidoscope to initially complete a general application (link on CEF website). You may save and edit the application as needed.

Once you submit the general application, you will be directed to a page listing each CEF scholarship you qualify for (indicated as a program). Each will note if an essay is required. If an essay is required, you will only be considered for that scholarship if you submit the essay. The essay questions and word limits are listed below. We advise that you prepare these ahead of time and paste them into the application. Evaluators will give priority consideration to those that have correct spelling, grammar and thoughtful, relavant content. The application will require:

- 1) A student email address that is regularly checked and is **not** a CCS address. (**no** parent addresses, please)
- 2) If you would like to be considered for scholarships that have financial need as a consideration (as noted in the FAFSA column) you will need to provide a PDF file of the **Student Aid Report (SAR)** including the **Estimated Family Contribution (EFC)** from your **Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) application**. FAFSA forms will only be viewed by Carmel Education Foundation staff.
- 3) A list, in priority order, of colleges, universities, trade schools, or certification programs you have applied to. Carmel High School (CHS) counseling staff will verify your commitment after May 1, 2023.
