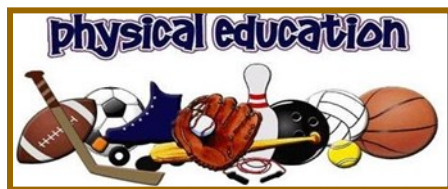

Kindergartners will start the new year off finishing our math work with numbers to 10 and beginning a new unit on 2D and 3D shapes. During language arts lessons, they will continue to listen and respond to literature, adding new words to their vocabulary, and building on their phonemic awareness and decoding skills. During writing, kindergartners will work on writing true stories with attention to starting each sentence with an uppercase letter, leaving spaces between words, and ending each sentence with a period or an exclamation point!

Happy New Year from second grade!

With a New Year, comes even more new learning!

In math, we are moving into our third unit this January called Numbers Within 1,000. In this unit, students will continue to develop their skills understanding the value of a digit in a number depends on its place in the number. This knowledge will help students to determine the total value of a number and will help them read, write, and compare numbers. Students will also learn how to build three-digit numbers in different ways, as well as add and subtract three digit numbers using multiple strategies.

In reading, we are moving into Unit 4, Studying Characters and their story. In this unit, students will work hard to infer about characters and dig deep into their stories. They will learn to identify what their characters say, do, and think to help them describe their character's traits. They will work inside early chapter books, accumulating the story and thinking about how chapters link together.

In writing, we will also be moving into our 4<sup>th</sup> unit of study called Writing Gripping Fictional Stories. In this unit, students will extend their narrative writing skills through gripping realistic fiction stories by emphasizing story structure. Students will learn how to build suspense in their fictional stories as well.

Happy New Year! We hope everyone has a relaxing and enjoyable holiday! In January we will be starting several new units. In reading, students will

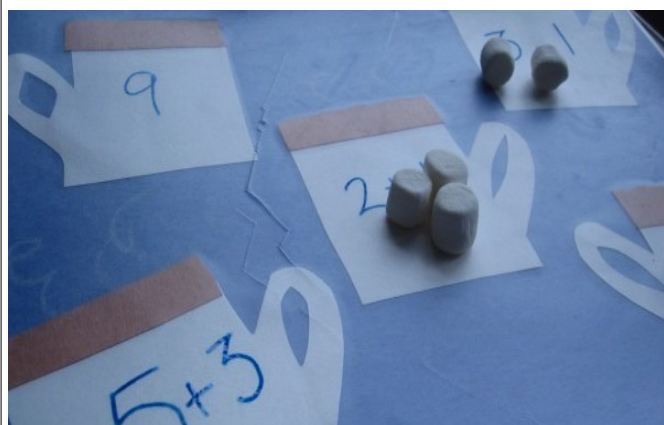

## Winter Math Activities

### Snowball Fight Math Challenge

Make a snowball fight with math challenges. This can be adapted to kids of all ages. For young children, you can just write numbers on papers, for older kids, you can write more complex math problems, addition, multiplication, or even multi-step calculations. After you write them on papers, you crumple them up to look like snowballs. Have kids toss the snowballs at each other or at a target, then go pick the snowballs up. They have to solve the math problems before they can pick up another ball. The one who has the most snowballs at the end wins the game.



### Hot Chocolate Math

Make paper hot chocolate mugs. Cover them with clear contact paper. Use a dry erase marker to write numbers (for younger students) or equations (for older students) to solve using marshmallows. Wipe clean and start over as needed.

### My Flake

My Flake is a very simple free app. While having fun designing their own snowflakes and seeing how the designs turn out, kids will learn about symmetry, especially hexagonal symmetry.

# Register for Kindergarten

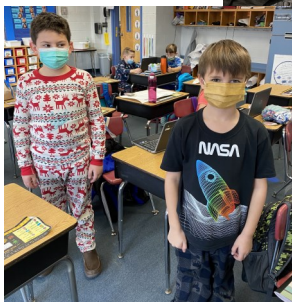
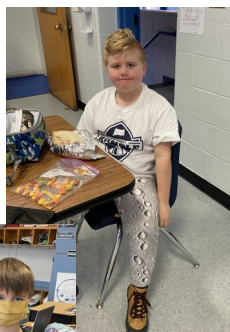

Original birth certificates (with a raised seal) should be shown at the time of registration. 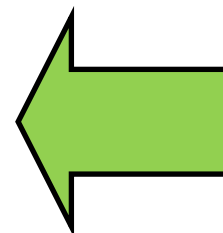

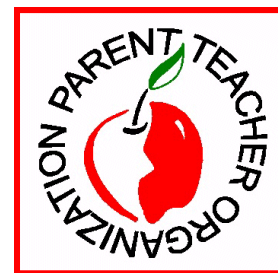

## SNOW CANCELLATION PROCEDURES

The decision to cancel/delay school is made between 5-5:30 a.m.

1. Transportation gets the report from the State Police and Public Works.
2. RSD #17 Superintendent consults with Transportation, Director of Fiscal Operations, area town superintendents and Director of Operations.
3. Weather conditions are reviewed using local and area media services.
4. A decision is made by the Superintendent using all available information.
5. School Messenger alert system is initiated.

If school is delayed, the start time will be at 10:40.

If school is dismissed early, the dismissal time will be at 1:05.

A decision to dismiss early will only be used when the threat of weather is predictable and probable. The logic here is as follows:

In some cases, we would be dismissing students during the height of road crews completing the treatment of the roads. It is always best to wait until treatments are completed to a certain level.

In some cases, we would be sending students home without anyone home and without advance notice. We respect the fact that many people work away from their homes.
