What is PBIS?

• A positive behavior management system designed to improve academic and behavioral success

 A set of established, school-wide behavioral expectations that are taught, modeled, and recognized

 Includes processes and procedures for intervention

• Celebrates individual and school-wide behavioral and academic achievement



How Can Parents Support PBIS at Home?

- Discuss the PAWsitive behaviors with your child (for example: ask your child to describe how they earned their PAW ticket)
- Relate your rules at home to the PAW behaviors expected at school
- Celebrate your child's successes with

• It is based on the assumption and belief that all children can learn and exhibit appropriate behavior

• It is teachable, positive, and proactive

• It provides school-wide consistency in language and expectations

Recognition of Positive Behavior

• When a student exhibits one of the PAW behaviors he or she may be verbally complimented or may be given a "PAW Buck", or in K-2, a Warm Fuzzy.

 PAW Bucks may be given to any student, by any staff member, in any part of the school building

• PAW Bucks may be cashed in for Prizes or Privileges

Interventions

When students are not experiencing success in the classroom, a plan of action is developed that is appropriate for the *specific* student and the *specific* behavior.

Student interventions may include:

• A teacher-student, teacherparent, and/or teacher-parentstudent conference

- Parent contact
- A visit to the support room



 A meeting with the school counselor

• An administrative referral or customized behavior plan

• Referrals for other appropriate school related services or to community agencies
