2020-2021 Audited Financial Statements

Chief Operations Officer, Cheryl Northam, introduced Ms. Aria Bettinger, an auditor and partner with accounting firm KDP CPAs LLP, A member of this year's audit team, Ms. Bettinger, shared the required communications to the school board subsequent to the completion of the 2020-2021 fiscal year audit. Following review of the main focus areas, Ms. Bettinger advised the Board that the audit had been awarded an "unmodified opinion", which is the highest level of assurance possible.

<u>Community Bond</u> <u>Development Presentation</u>

After meeting since August 2021, members of a Community Bond Development Committee shared their process and findings with the Board of Directors. Committee members Aric Groshong, Corrie Peachey-Briggs, Jennifer Sikes and Lance Colley shared insights developed throughout the process. Dr. Groshong and the team began by explaining the "Why" behind this bond effort, specifically

- ♦ An investment in Roseburg's children is an investment in our community's future.
- ♦ Our children deserve to learn and grow in safe, secure, healthy educational environments.
- ♦ Our schools are our community's assets and their responsible stewardship includes maintaining and improving community investments.
- Every school in our district will experience increased safety, accessibility and quality educational upgrades.
- ♦ Economic development investment opportunity that will continue to accelerate partnerships throughout and beyond our community that benefit both our youth and our adults.
- ♦ Roseburg Public Schools has no capital improvement bond.

The committee's role included reviewing the District's vision, enrollment trends and facility needs; reviewing polling data specific to bond scenarios; served as advocates for the process in our community; and prioritizing investment priorities to best serve students. Community polling resulted in a proposed \$154 million bond with an estimated bond rate of \$1.85/ \$1000 of assessed value to be applied to health, safety and security (39%); building systems and energy efficiency (23%); and educational improvements (38%). The Board will deliberate on the recommended bond package at their January 12, 2022 meeting.

Resolution 21-22-13: Accept and Appropriate Coronavirus Recovery Grant

The Board approved the request to approve Resolution 21-22-13 accepting and appropriating a Coronavirus Recovery Grant from the State of Oregon in the amount of \$211,927 to provide highspeed data access and acquiring classroom equipment for remote learning.

Student Leadership Report:

RHS leadership student Marin Gray shared updates of current happenings at RHS. This week is Winter Week with lots of fun activities for the added enjoyment of the students. The week wraps up with an Ugly Sweater Day tomorrow. The campus is sporting a festive look complete with snowflakes and holiday decorations for all to enjoy. The library is hosting creative workshops. Leadership students are now preparing to mentor younger students to take on leadership roles next year. Sports are in high gear with the wrestling team travelling to Nevada this weekend for a championship tournament.
