Position Summary:

Teachers at Dunn work closely with their peers in a collaborative, cooperative, student-centered academic environment. Dunn is a community of educators and learners that is deeply dedicated to Whole Student Education. We are in search of a classroom teacher to provide curriculum and instruction for our 12th-grade American Studies course in our Humanities Department. There are two approaches we can take with this course:

- The first is to have one experienced teacher step into a part-time role to teach the classes (two sections each of American Studies and Advanced American Studies) for the remainder of the semester.
- 2. The second approach is to treat this as a survey course for the second semester and have several experienced teachers provide independent units of the course for three or four weeks at a time. A combination of virtual and in-person teaching can also be considered.

The ideal candidate for this position will have the following professional skills, characteristics, and qualifications:

- History teaching experience (certification is not required) in a 9th- through 12th-grade educational environment
- Bachelor's degree (Master's degree preferred)
- Growth mindset, flexibility, comfort with quick pace of change and openness to collaboration and experimentation
- Excellent writing skills and desire to engage students in writing across the curriculum



- Demonstrated ability to integrate technology in content delivery/skill development
- Demonstrable commitment to professional growth, openness to feedback and improvement, modeling lifelong learning of practice as well as subject area
- A sense of humor, a commitment to teaching the whole student, and a desire to help guide adolescents in their journey from childhood to young adulthood

Roles and Responsibilities

- Teach 4 to 5 sections of history, including advanced levels
- Teach 1-2 Wednesday afternoon enrichment classes (5 Wednesdays/class)
- Teach 1 Mini-Term class (1 week)
- Coach I season of after-school athletics or activities
- Residential duty in the dormitories (2-3 nights/month Sunday-Thursday)
- Weekend duty (approximately five weekend duty shifts and five Friday night duty shifts)
- Student advisor (4-6 students)
- Participation in the Dunn School Leadership Program
