



### Bird's Eye View with Fr. Pellican



In the Gospel today we hear the beautiful story of the magi coming from afar in search of Jesus. These men, who were more likely wise advisors to kings than kings themselves, set out on a journey to a completely unknown land,

bringing fine gifts for someone they had no proof actually existed. They were searching for something, something beyond all the wisdom of the East they had amassed during their lifetime. Though they may not have clearly understood it, they were in search of Divine wisdom. They journeyed to encounter the Divine Word, the perfect revelation of God himself. On this wondrous feast of the Epiphany, we are reminded by their searching that each one of us has a longing in our own hearts for something more, and this causes us in this life to be constantly searching. Some search to fill or numb this longing in unhealthy and even destructive ways. The magi remind us that ultimately what we all search for is something beyond this world. We search for God himself. And God made himself accessible to us through the incarnation.

The word 'epiphany' means 'to shine forth.' On this feast we recall how the star of Bethlehem shone forth and guided the magi to Jesus. We remember as well the words of St. John about Jesus' incarnation: "the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it" (Jn 1:5). Jesus is the light of grace, truth and hope who shines in the midst of this world. This brings to mind a line from the Christmas carol, *Oh Holy Night*, which goes like this: "The weary world rejoices, for yonder breaks a new and glorious morn." This glorious morning light about which we sing is none other than Christ, the light of the world (Jn 8:12). May the light of Christ shine in


our hearts, in our families, and in our world to dispel all darkness, bringing renewal in the midst of weariness and hope amid trials. May we find in Jesus the truth, joy, and goodness for which we all long.



### St. Elizabeth Ann Seton: Feast Day January 4 Patron of Catholic Schools, Widows and Seafarers

Elizabeth Ann Bayley was born in New York City on August 28, 1774 to a prominent Episcopal family, and lost her mother at the age of three. At the age of 19, Elizabeth married William Magee Seton, a wealthy businessman with whom she had five children. William died of tuberculosis in 1803, leaving Elizabeth a young widow. She entered the Catholic Church in 1805 and founded the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph in Emmitsburg, Maryland, the first community for religious women established in the United States. She also began St. Joseph's Academy.

Mother Seton, as she is often called, was canonized on Sunday, September 14, 1975 in St. Peter's Square by Pope Paul VI. She was the first citizen born in the United States to be given the title of "Saint."

### St. John Neumann: Feast Day January 5 Patron Saint of Educators and Teachers

John Neumann was born in what is now the Czech Republic. After studying in Prague, he came to New York at 25 and was ordained a priest. He did missionary work in New York until he was 29, when he joined the Redemptorists and became its first member to profess vows in the United States. He continued missionary work in Maryland, Virginia and Ohio, where he became popular with the Germans.

At 41, as bishop of Philadelphia, he organized the parochial school system into a diocesan one, increasing the number of pupils almost twentyfold within a short time.

Gifted with outstanding organizing ability, he drew into the city many teaching communities of sisters and the Christian Brothers. During his brief assignment as vice provincial for the Redemptorists, he placed them in the forefront of the parochial movement.

Well-known for his holiness and learning, spiritual writing and preaching, on October 13, 1963, John Neumann became the first American bishop to be beatified. Canonized in 1977, he is buried in St. Peter the Apostle Church in Philadelphia.

# DCES Christmas Festival







Every first Saturday of the month following the 4:30pm Mass. In emergency situations, when the office is closed, the emergency line attendant will take the call.

**Baptisms** 

Arrangements must be made in advance and parents must attend a **Baptism class** prior to the Baptism.

The Church requires that at least one of the parents and one of the godparents/sponsors be practicing Catholics; that is, they attend Mass each weekend.

Marriages

One person of the couple must be an active, registered parishioner of Divine Child for at least 6 months. (Exceptions are made for DC alumni.) The Church requires a minimum of 6 months for marriage preparation. Potential wedding date is not confirmed until couple meets with a Divine Child priest. The celebrant will be a Divine Child priest unless the couple has someone close to them who is a Catholic priest. Music for the liturgy must be coordinated with our Director of Music Ministry, Mr. Matthew Simpson.

Arrangements are made in conjunction with the funeral home. Eulogies must be given at the funeral home or at the funeral luncheon; no eulogies at the funeral Mass, please. Memorial Masses are scheduled Monday-Friday only.
