A message from the **PRESIDENT**

Dear Alumni and Friends of Central Catholic:

Here on campus, we spend our time working with young people, intent on making our world a better place and carrying the crucial mission of Central Catholic into the future. Occasionally, though, we pause to look back and celebrate the richness of our history and the events that have helped shape who we are, and who we strive to be. There are, of course, many important moments in the journey of Central Catholic, starting always with the foresight of our beloved founder, Br. Florentius.As Central legend, Mr. Warren Hayes '54 – who sadly passed away in June 2021 – said in his book, <u>Honorable Mentions: A Central Catholic High School Retrospect</u>:

"It was Florentius who had the faith, the charm, and the political savvy to harness the social and political forces necessary to get things going. He cajoled, borrowed, leased, and prayed his way (and) The fruit of his labor still flourishes."

Since that time, Central has enjoyed myriad successes and celebrated countless historical events. None, however, better reflect Florentius' vision and legacy than the decision, in 1993, by Br. Rick Carey and the Board of Directors for Central Catholic to open its doors for young women. In September of 1995, when the Class of 1999 became our first coeducational freshman class, and the classes of 1996, 1997 and 1998 welcomed the young women from St. Mary's High School and a few legacy transfers, we became a better school. Most recently, we've also welcomed students and alumni from Presentation of Mary Academy to join the CCHS family.

It is impossible to walk our halls today and not feel the immediate impact and wisdom of that decision. A Central Catholic education is meant to reflect the world in which we want to live – just, collaborative, and a place where all our students are affirmed and respected for who they are and their capacity to learn and achieve.

I hope you enjoy reading some of the reflections of this momentous time at Central Catholic. It is more than appropriate that my friend and colleague, Ms. Jeanne Burns, our Academic Dean, share her thoughts in these pages. Jeanne is, herself, a Central legend, and worked tirelessly then, and works tirelessly now, to advocate for all our students. Her impact on the decision to become a coeducational institution, and her work to ensure a successful transition will never be fully appreciated.

I referenced Warren Hayes' historical retrospective earlier, and I return to it now. Warren completed and published his book in the spring of 1995, just prior to the start of coeducation at Central. His final words in that book are both appropriate and prophetic:

"It is fitting that the last words of this brief historical review should be devoted to women. Their presence as students and teachers will contribute to the completeness of each man's and each woman's understanding of one another."

Thank you for your constant support of Central Catholic, our students and our mission.

> It's time to shout out The stories continue to grow It's time to celebrate twenty five years of coeducation at Central Catholic



In 1993, the Board of Directors of Central Catholic made a critical decision to chart a new course for the future of Central Catholic. In a proactive response to the many changes and challenges that the twenty-first century was going to present, and to a variety of demographic changes taking place in the Merrimack Valley and Greater Lawrence communities, the Board voted to make Central Catholic High School a coeducational institution.

Principal from 1991-1999, Br. Richard Carey and a team of educators and board members from Central Catholic and St. Mary's embarked on a three-year journey to plan and prepare for the creation of a coeducational school. According to Br. Rick, "It was more than facilities and physical accommodations that needed to change. The mission and mindset needed a reset. The curriculum, activities and school leadership also needed to reflect the diversity of the school's future population."









On a beautiful fall morning in September of 1996, Central Catholic opened its doors to young men and women for the first time in school history. These students would go on to create and establish new traditions and histories that were grounded in the belief that coeducation was a more realistic way to educate students for a future in a diverse community.

I (Jeanne Burns) have been blessed with the privilege of serving Central Catholic for almost an equal amount of time in both the world of an all male school and a coeducational school. Given that perspective, I want to share with you some of the reasons why we need to shout out and celebrate the success of twenty five years of coeducation.

One of the greatest outcomes has been the opportunity for students to develop a more diverse network of friends, thus providing a foundation for more respectful and realistic relationships in later life. High school is not just about dating. In the classroom and in activities, our students are able to explore, debate and think critically about many topics and ideas. Regardless of the gender of the audience, the students become more comfortable and confident expressing their views.

During these formative years, students learn to accept and embrace differences and similarities and recognize everyone has value and can learn from one another. Over the years, gender misconceptions and stereotypes have lessened and students have a deeper understanding and support for all their classmates. On both an intellectual and social level, students are able to experience the unique perspectives of a more diverse population and are able to grow a better understanding and ability to work and live in a culture of inclusivity. Alumni who graduated prior to 1997 and have children who have graduated post 1997 often state that, because of a coeducational environment, their children are better prepared to go on to college and professional careers and vocations. They attribute their children's success to the growth of respect for individual differences and with their child's enhanced confidence and positive self image that developed over their years at Central Catholic. As Plato declared over a thousand years ago, "coeducation creates comradeship."

Our celebration of the success of twenty five years of coeducation would not be possible without the vision and work of many men and women who served with me on the Coeducation Committee. We are grateful to Sr. Mary Farren, Sr. Judith Cooper, Sr. Mary Jude, Ms. Denise Horan, Ms. Patricia Palermo, Br. Richard Carey, Br. William Lambert, Mr. James Martin, Mr. Robert King, Mr. Laurence Rossi '64, Mr. Michael Morris '59, Mr. David DeFillippo '66, Mr. William Cowie '59, and Mr. Christopher Sullivan '81. We are also grateful to all the faculty and staff who have carried this mission forward and have provided loving and caring role models for all our young men and women.

Half a Century in the Spotlight – THEATRE GUILD TURNS 50!

Over five decades and over 200 performances starring thousands of students and proud faculty, staff and alumni, Theatre Guild continues to entertain the masses year after year... even during a global pandemic.

The Debut of **THEATRE GUILD**

In 1971, an eager group of Raider theater enthusiasts performed "Ten Little Indians" – a performance that kicked off Central Catholic's journey to establish a dedicated theatre group.

It wasn't until 1972 when the performance group was officially dubbed Theatre Guild, after CCHS alumnus **Mr. Thomas A. Kirkman '60** (formerly Brother) was asked by then CCHS Principal Br. William Lambert if he'd be interested in working with a group of students to start a theatre program. Tom eagerly accepted! Br. John Murray agreed to be the Technical Director and he gathered a group of students to build sets.

The Theatre Guild's debut production was "See How They Run," and by springtime, the group was ready to move on to musicals with "Guys and Dolls." Central – as an all-boys

school at the time - had plenty of male actors to play the role of 'Guys', but finding female students for the 'Dolls' took a bit more effort.

"I made appointments with the principals of the local girls' schools to ask if they would be willing to announce our productions and invite their students to audition as well," said Tom.

The sets were built on the ground floor of the original building, and theatre lighting was minimal, so the on-off light switch worked to end an act or scene. "In time, we were able to borrow lighting items from the gym stage, and props from around campus or donated materials. For the most part, the cast provided their own costumes," said Tom, who served as Theatre Guild Director through 1978 and directed 11 productions.

THEATRE GUILD has come a long way since the 1970s!

Ms. Karen Moynihan '69^{5M}, former Chair of the CCHS English Department, served as a longtime, much-beloved Director of Theatre Guild. She worked with scores of students, directing over 30 shows, including 11 musicals. The 45th season of Theatre Guild was dedicated to Karen's dedication to transforming the growing program.

Since 2004, **Mrs. Sharman Merrill '87**SM, a faculty member in the English Department, has served as Director of Theatre Guild, but this isn't the first time she found herself on the Central stage. As a student at St. Mary's High School, Sharman participated in three shows when CCHS asked for female participants.

"That's when I met the incomparable Karen Moynihan and fell in love with the CCHS Theatre Guild," said Sharman.

To date, Sharman has directed 26 shows and co-directed six shows with **Mr. Matthew Joyal '08**, who became co-director of Theatre Guild in 2017. She has also written six original productions, including the script for *A Year with Roxane* - Central's first original musical, which featured songs written by Matthew Joyal.

"I believe it's important for students to be exposed to the Arts in all forms, which gives students a safe place to be themselves and a chance to explore their creativity." said Sharman. "Theatre, in particular, provides opportunities for actors, dancers, singers, painters, designers, and makeup artists to share their talents by telling stories that can be funny or tragic, silly or profound."

In addition to the incredible talents of Sharman and Matthew, Theatre Guild features a dedicated group of talented faculty and staff members including *Mr. Andrew Murray* and *Mr. Mark Svendsen* as Co-Technical Directors, *Mrs. Christine (Leonard) Thompson '06* as Assistant Director and Choreographer, *Ms. Kellie Leavitt* as Vocal Coach, *Mrs. Alyssa (Torres) Gowing '05* as Hair and Makeup Coordinator, and *Mr. Andrew Joyal '11* as the Technical Supervisor. For musical productions,

the pit includes faculty and staff members **Mr. Richard Cavanaugh, Mr. Timothy Hart '85, Mr. Andrew Joyal '11** and **Mr. Brian Griffin**.

In April 2021, when a global pandemic made live performance with an in-person audience incredibly difficult, Theatre Guild got innovative, offering a virtual Festival of One-Act Plays via Zoom. The festival featured three shows with three separate ensembles and a handful of individual musical performances: *Trifles* by Susan Glaspell, *The Summer People* by Shirley Jackson, and *The Great Pandemonium* by Pat Cook.

"I think that there will always be a place and need for live theatre at CCHS," said Matthew Joyal. "The past year has forced us to reinvent what we've done, but we can't wait to get back to what we do best. If we have learned anything, it is that there is no substitute for the energy and love that fills Central's Allen B. Rogers Memorial Theater when the lights come up."

This academic year, Theatre Guild will officially celebrate its 50th birthday with:

- CCHS Theatre Guild: A Musical Revue (November 19 & 20, 2021).
- In the spring, the performance will be an original show called **Schooled!** *a jukebox musical* (April 7,8 & 9,2021).

"I am proud that Theatre Guild has been an important part of many students' CCHS experience and that many have created lifelong friendships in the midst of these productions," said Sharman. "Our audiences may see the sets and performances we've created, but the memories we most treasure are those that happen backstage, during long "Super Sunday" rehearsals, dancing "the Hustle," and enjoying a place where every student feels valued."







Reach Back *** Our Shining Stars Keep on Shining!

Michelle Abou-Raad '12, Anya Housianitis '13, and Elvin Rosa '21 - all CCHS Shining Stars in their respective years - were excellent students, academically and beyond, but they left a larger mark on Central Catholic. They pioneered and perpetuated the award-winning Marist Mentors Program, which recently celebrated its 10th anniversary of mentoring children at the Boys & Girls Club of Lawrence.

In 2010, **Michelle Abou-Raad '12** developed this unique mentoring program after attending a Marist Brothers Youth Conference with hundreds of students from Marist schools across the country. Attendees were challenged to develop a project that would honor the Marist calling to serve the *"least favored"* and make a much-needed difference in the community.

"At the conference, the Central Catholic group discussed seeing young children walk home from school alone in Lawrence and we expressed our concern about the availability of mentors for these kids" said Michelle. "From that, we developed the idea of a program in which Central students could be the mentors."

With assistance from the CCHS Campus Ministry staff and collaboration with the Boys & Girls Club of Lawrence, Michelle - along with **Anya Housianitis '13**, officially founded the Central Catholic Marist Mentors Program.



For ten years, and with hundreds of inner-city children served at the Boys & Girls Club of Lawrence, Marist Mentors continue to volunteer weekly as mentors to kids in grades three and up. In 2018, the program was presented with the Paul W. Cronin Mentor Award for Volunteer Service by the Boys & Girls Club of Lawrence.

Recent CCHS grad **Elvin Rosa '21** – who completed over 850 community service hours through Central - carried the torch for the Marist Mentors at CCHS.

Elvin was seven years old when he started attending the Boys and Girls Club of Lawrence. **Anya Housianitis '13** was his Marist Mentor - she played games with Elvin, helped with homework, and served as his best friend at the Club.

"This program changed my life!" explains Elvin, who joined Marist Mentors his freshman year as a co-leader. "I spent a lot of time at the Boys and Girls Club, and I've witnessed how kids in Lawrence struggle with many things, such as poverty, homework, and fitting in. I am proud to have led the program and serve as a successful mentor."

Elvin was named 2020 Boys and Girls Club of Lawrence as Youth of the Year. At Commencement, he was also awarded the Br.Vincent Dinnean, FMS Outstanding Christian Service Award for his commitment to serving others.

Thanks to Michelle, Anya and Elvin – and to all who have answered the Marist call to serve and support this life-changing program!



Honoring Our Most Loyal Raiders

RAIDER FOR LIFE: LEADERSHIP, GENEROSITY & COMMITMENT TO INNOVATION

Mr. G.Thomas (Tom) Catalano '50, who passed away on February 6, 2021, was instrumental in responding to the critical needs of Central Catholic multiple times over the years. His generosity ensured that hundreds of CCHS students have - and will continue to make - incredible advances in the arts, technology and sciences. He was also willing and able to take on leadership roles on Central's Board of Directors several times.

Additionally, Tom was one of Central Catholic's most generous philanthropists in the history of the school, giving over \$1.4 million dollars to support a multitude of CCHS initiatives, including an endowed scholarship in his name - **The G.Thomas ('50) & Marie Catalano Fund**. He also included Central Catholic in his estate plans.

MORE ABOUT THOMAS CATALANO

Tom, who grew up in Lawrence, MA, was an active CCHS Board member for 19 years - two of which he served as President, and in 1995, he led a successful multi-million-dollar capital campaign for the school which resulted in the renovation of the school's classrooms and important Memorial Gymnasium infrastructure. He also faithfully participated in the Annual Fund and was a member of the President's Leadership Circle at the Marian Society Level.

As a full-scholarship student at Central Catholic, Tom's leadership skills emerged by taking on the role of Class President for four years, serving as Student Council Secretary and President during two of those years, and he was a Legion of Honor member. He also played football for four years and served as Captain of the team in his senior year. He was recognized by his peers as the "most influential" 1950 classmate and a finalist for both "most popular" and the ideal 1950 Central Catholic student.

Following graduation, Tom headed off to the U.S. Coast Guard Academy and upon graduation in 1954, returned to Central Catholic to teach Math, and serve as the freshman football coach for three years.

Off the field, Tom embarked on an almost 45-year career in the insurance business - as owner of The Catalano Insurance Agency, which continued to grow to several locations before his retirement in 1999.

Tom left a lasting imprint on the CCHS community and was honored for his commitment to Central Catholic with the St. Marcellin Champagnat Award for Philanthropic Leadership in 2012.

Tom and his wife Marie (Galvagna) Catalano, who passed away March 19, 2020, made their home in North Andover, Massachusetts, but also spent time in Florida and Maine. They left behind four children Thomas Catalano, Barbara Catalano Hey, Catherine Catalano Scott, and Claudia Catalano, and a long legacy of Raiders: **Sebastian F. Catalano '48**, Brother (deceased); **Thomas B. Hey '70**, Son-in-Law; **Matthew Palmisano '10**, Great Nephew; **Rachel Palmisano '08**, Great Niece; **Andrew D. Scott '09**, Grandson; **Stephanie M. Scott '12**, Granddaughter; **Brian G. Sweeney '03**, Great Nephew; and **Tara M. Sweeney '05**, Great Niece.




REMEMBERING 'THE KID,' A CENTRAL CATHOLIC LEGEND

Mr. Ronald T. Maheu '60, who passed away on January 31, 2021, was a cherished member of the Central Catholic family.

Also a former Board member and chair of the Finance Committee, Ron was passionate in emphasizing the importance of establishing and growing the CCHS endowment fund, as well as formalizing reliable retirement plans for CCHS lay faculty and staff.

His personal generosity was endless as one of the most active benefactors in the history of Central Catholic. Ron also left Central in his estate plans.

Ron was honored for his commitment to CCHS during Central's Golf Classic (2005), and in 2018 was a recipient of the St. Marcellin Champagnat Award for Philanthropic Support of the Mission of Central Catholic.

While a student at Central, Ron was a member of the Varsity Football and Basketball Teams, and his classmates voted him as the "Best Student" and was always seen to have a pleasant smile and sparkling personality. Ron was chosen as the recipient of the Michael Garvey Award as the outstanding studentathlete in the Class of 1960, and in 1996 he was honored with induction into the Central Catholic High School Athletic Hall of Fame. After graduating from CCHS, Ron earned a B.A. from the College of the Holy Cross, with an M.B.A. from Boston University and an M.S. in taxation from Bentley College. He also served as a Captain in the United States Marine Corps during the Vietnam War.

He went on to work as a Senior Partner for Pricewaterhouse Coopers (PwC) until his retirement in 2002, but continued serving on boards for various organizations. He was a philanthropist who continued to give back to his family, community and organizations that were close to his heart throughout his life. Over his career, he provided strategic financial guidance to Raytheon, Digital Equipment Corporation and EMC, just to name a few.

Ron was also a founding member of Coopers & Lybrand's Board of Partners and he chaired the company's U.S. Technology Industry Program. He has served on both the U.S. and Global Boards of Partners & Principals for Pricewaterhouse Coopers, chaired the National High Tech Group and the Audit Committee of Associated Industries of Massachusetts - the largest nonprofit, non-partisan association of Massachusetts employers.

Ron is survived by his wife of 49 years, Jane, and his three children, Tyler Maheu, Nicole Maheu, and Ryan Maheu.






