

Continuing Interdistrict Permit Students

Frequently Asked Questions

Do I need to renew Wiseburn's permit annually?

No. All students currently attending a Wiseburn school on an interdistrict permit can remain in Wiseburn until they leave or graduate from 8th grade, provided they reply to the Verification of Continuing Enrollment notice annually and uphold appropriate standards of behavior and attendance.

What is the Verification of Continuing Enrollment Notice?

Students who currently attend school in Wiseburn must verify that they are returning to Wiseburn for the following school year by replying to the Verification of Continuing Enrollment notice that families will receive in January.

Do I need to renew my resident school district release annually?

Students are not required to reapply for an interdistrict permit release from their school of residence under Assembly Bill 2444 that was passed on September 24, 2010. AB 2444 states that if your child is currently enrolled in the district of attendance (Wiseburn) as a permit student, you do NOT have to reapply for his/her release permit from your district of residence for him/her to continue enrollment in the district of attendance (Wiseburn) - this is Wiseburn's interpretation of AB 2444 and most school districts.

However, Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD) and Inglewood Unified School District's interpretation of AB 2444 is that students who have a valid permit to attend a specific school may continue attendance in that same school without the need to re-apply annually to the district of residence or attendance. When the student matriculates, or there is a change of school placement, regardless if it is in the same school district of attendance, a new permit is required.

Until further notice from Wiseburn, **ONLY LAUSD and IUSD families need to re-apply for the release permit** <u>only</u> if your child is a current Anza or 138th Street 5th grader going to Dana for the 2022-2023 school year.

Do I need to apply for a new release permit if I move to a new resident school district?

Yes, if you recently moved out of your current resident school district to another school district, then you will need to obtain a new release permit from the new school district. You will need to provide a copy to the Enrollment/Outreach Coordinator Alicia Galindo at <u>agalindo@wiseburn.org</u>.

Do I need to apply for a release permit if I am enrolling a new child to Wiseburn?
