<u>The St. Ann "APP"</u>: Associate Pastor's Perspective - I recently came across this quote shared by Immaculee Ilibagiza, a survivor of the Rwandan genocide who now speaks and writes about the power of faith and forgiveness so desperately needed in our world:

#### "Behind every story of true love, there is a story of great patience."

What an incredible thought to ponder in our hearts as we begin a New Year. A year filled once again with hope and promise, but also one that will undoubtedly bring some heartache and anxiety and challenge along the way. Into 2022 we step together – desiring to bring love to the world around us, but also knowing that this very same love takes time and patience to grow, to heal, and to give itself away to the ones that aren't always open to accepting it.

And yet we also know that it is only through Christ that this patient love can be offered in the first place. He who is Mercy Itself and is so patient with us in our own brokenness now asks us to offer that same gift: to the spouse who forgets to ask how our day was; to the child who struggles with behavioral and emotional outbursts; to the friend who keeps making the same mistake; and even to ourselves when we stumble along the way time and again.

**NEXT SUNDAY - Election of Trustees –** Each parish in the Diocese of Wilmington is incorporated within and by the laws of the State in which it is located. The by-laws of the Corporation and the statutes of the Diocese of Wilmington provide for five trustees; the Bishop of the Diocese, and the Pastor, and a priest so designated by the Bishop, (these days it is the Chancellor of the Diocese) and two (2) lay persons are to be elected each January by duly registered members of the parish in the meeting called by the President (the Pastor). That election is scheduled for Sunday - January 9th, following the 10:30am Mass. Our current lay trustees are Charles Klous and David O'Connor.
