"For every believer, and especially for Christian families, the humble dwelling place in Nazareth is an authentic school of the Gospel. Here we admire, put into practice, the divine plan to make the family an intimate community of life and love; here we learn that every Christian family is called to be a small "domestic church" that must shine with the Gospel virtues. Recollection and prayer, mutual

understanding and respect, personal discipline and community asceticism and a spirit of sacrifice, work and solidarity are typical features that make the family of Nazareth a model for every home." St. John Paul II

"In the family life of Mary and Joseph, God is truly at the center, and He is so in the Person of Jesus. This is why the Family of Nazareth is holy. Why? Because it is centered on Jesus. When parents and children together breathe in this climate of faith,



they have an energy that allows them to face even difficult trials, as the experience of the Holy Family shows, for example, in the dramatic event of their flight to Egypt: a difficult ordeal. Any transcript requests for February or March deadlines or rolling admission schools should be submitted as soon as possible.

Seniors can send their acceptances, scholarships, and grants to Ms. Mikulski via email or they can bring in their letters for Ms. Mikulski to copy.

Class of 2023

Student should follow this <u>LINK</u> to access the **College Brag Survey**. **This form must be submitted by 11:59 PM on February 18, 2022**. This form will close at 11:59 PM on February 18, 2022. Students should email their college counselor after they have submitted this form that way we can verify that we have it. We recommend writing their answers in a word doc and pasting them into the survey to avoid any potential technical problems where they might lose the information.

Students should follow this <u>LINK</u> if they would like to sign up for the SAT School Day being offered on April 13, 2022. **They have until 11:59PM on March 5, 2022 to sign up via the link**. The cost is \$55 or \$8 if you meet income eligibility guidelines (the link for IEG is in the Microsoft Form). You will receive a payment form for the SAT School Day via email closer to April 13, 2022.

Students must ask two teachers for letters of recommendation by April 8, 2022. These teachers should be from sophomore or junior year. Students can meet with their college counselor to discuss who they are thinking about asking. Students should complete the Teacher Recommendation Questionnaire for each teacher and have it with them when they ask teachers to write their letters. Students should tell their college counselor who agrees to write letters of recommendation for so that the teacher can be added to their Naviance account.

The **FAFSA** application opened October 1st. Seniors and their families should complete this federal student aid <u>application</u> sooner rather than later for college purposes. Students should check with their colleges to see if there are priority deadlines for FAFSA submission.

The **PA State Grant** program is associated with the FAFSA. There should be more information about PA State grants on the confirmation page you receive after submitting the FAFSA next year. Here is the <u>LINK</u> for the PA State Grant Program if you are interested in seeing if you are eligible to complete this application.

The **CSS Profile** is completed for certain schools in addition to the FAFSA. Here is a link to the <u>Student</u> Guide for the CSS Profile.

Going Merry offers financial aid <u>resources</u> and a way to <u>complete the FAFSA</u> application through their site. Many of your students may have accounts with Going Merry already for scholarship searches. They should be able to use this account to complete the FAFSA if they would rather use Going Merry instead of the FAFSA site.

CollegeBoard offers <u>CLEP exams</u> for students to potentially earn college credit. If a student receives a passing score on an exam, there is a chance that their college may accept it for college credit. You can follow the previous link for more information and follow this <u>LINK</u> to see the colleges and universities that accept CLEP exam scores.
