Focus on Feelings

In the fall, our 2nd grade team knew that giving our students the opportunity to understand their own emotions would be particularly helpful this year. Teacher Charlotte Wallin returned to St. Mark's after teaching at a Montessori school in Boston, and she brought with her several components of social-emotional learning. Our 2nd graders are learning to talk about how they are feeling each day, and recognizing that any feeling they may have is acceptable. Students work with a Mood Meter, which is a four quadrant chart showing combinations of energy and pleasantness levels. If a student is feeling too energetic, they're encouraged to visit the "Take a Break Spot" in the classroom, which includes yoga cards and a two minute timer. Or they can head out in the hallway to complete some movement activities that help bring down their energy levels. Fundamentally, our 2nd grade team is working to show our students how their moods and feelings can impact their ability to learn and grow.
