DIRECTORS



FRANCISCO CALVO DIRECTOR OF PERFORMING ARTS, PERFORMING ARTS DEPARTMENT CHAIR AND DIRECTOR OF VOCAL MUSIC

Mr. Francisco Calvo is highly respected in Southern California as a conductor, pianist, composer/arranger and musicologist.

As a musicologist, Mr. Calvo has taught at the community college and university levels and has contributed to Grove Music Online through Oxford Music. The Cole Conservatory named Mr. Calvo Outstanding Music Historian for his achievements in musicology in 2007. As a conductor, his choirs and orchestras have received critical acclaim in the U. S. and abroad. As a composer/arranger, Mr. Calvo has

worked on Hollywood films, and his original compositions are frequently commissioned by local school districts. He is published through Warming Sun Music and J.W. Pepper & Sons, a member of the American Musicological Society, and was one of six people in the U.S. to receive the society's 2009-10 Eileen Southern Award. Mr. Calvo is also a member of the American Choral Directors Association. Mr. Calvo began teaching at SMCHS in 2002 and now serves as the director of performing arts, performing arts department chair and director of vocal music. During the summer of 2019, Mr. Calvo took the choral program to the Netherlands and Belgium. Mr. Calvo also teaches Intro. to Music History and World Cultures of Music at Chapman University.



W. CHRIS WINN CHORAL AND THEATRE, ACCOMPANIST AND DIRECTOR

Mr. Chris Winn's teaching experience has spanned from elementary classroom music to high school and college positions. He has been teaching in the Performing Arts Department at Santa Margarita Catholic High School for eight years as accompanist and director of multiple choirs. He has performed for numerous professional and regional theatre productions, including eight musical theatre productions at SMCHS. He is also director of music at St. Paul Lutheran Church in Fullerton. He has played extensively as a soloist and director of musical ensembles. Mr. Winn earned a Bachelor of Music in Education and Organ Performance from Pacific Union College and a Master of Education from Concordia University Portland.



DR. CHRISTOPHER CLARINO DIRECTOR OF INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC

Dr. Christopher Clarino serves as director of instrumental music here at SMCHS, where he leads the Wind Ensemble, String Orchestra, Symphony Orchestra, Guitar Ensemble, Men's Choir, Marching Band and Pep Band. He received his bachelor's degrees in music education and performance from the Eastman School of Music, his master's degree in performance from Stony Brook University, and his doctorate in contemporary music performance from the University of California San Diego. As a percussionist, Dr. Clarino has been invited to perform at Carnegie Hall, Harvard University, Georgetown University, SUNY New Paltz, The San Diego Museum of Art and

the Percussive Arts Society International Convention. He has been featured as soloist with the Eastman Wind Ensemble, the USMA Concert Band at West Point, the La Jolla Symphony Chorus, the Fredonia Wind Ensemble and the Greater Newburgh Symphony Orchestra. He has also performed with the Paul Taylor Dance Company, Bang On A Can, the Ojai Music Festival, the LA Philharmonic's annual "Noon to Midnight" marathon concert, the Festival Internacional Cervantino and Monday Evening Concerts. Dr. Clarino's recordings have been released by New World Records and Sideband Records, and his recordings of works by Tom DeLio will be released by Neuma Records later this year. His doctoral dissertation, "At the Intersection of American Sign Language and the Performer-Percussionist: A Hybrid Practice," chronicles both the roles of gesture and language in the percussion repertoire, addresses abstraction, gestural iconicity, corporeality and cultural ownership, and documents his efforts at merging ASL and percussion into a new and idiosyncratic genre of interdisciplinary performance art. Dr. Clarino has studied under Steve Schick, John Beck, Michael Burritt and Eduardo Leandro.



AMANDA DUNCAN DIRECTOR OF PERCUSSION

Ms. Amanda Duncan is a multi-faceted percussionist and music educator based in Southern California. She has taught music since 2004 to people of all ages and abilities. She is the director of percussion at Santa Margarita Catholic High School - where she teaches Steel Drums, Percussion, and AP Music Theory - and the percussion instructor at Orange Coast College. She also teaches through The Den Collective, an online music lesson platform and community. As a performer, Ms. Duncan plays drums and percussion with a wide variety of groups throughout Los Angeles and Orange County. She frequently performs and records with Tracy Thornton and Pan

Rocks!, drums and keyboards with her band Three Forks Junction, local musical theatre companies, online virtual steel band projects, and has shared the stage and recording studio with artists ranging from Mike Portnoy, Stephen Perkins, and Billy Sheehan to Liam Teague, Martin Chalifour, and Michael Giacchino. Ms. Duncan also serves as chair of the Communication and Outreach Committee for the National Society of Steel Band Educators and worked as music supervisor for the short documentary "The Jill of the Trade," produced by Xplore the World Productions. She's been interviewed by the Trinidad Guardian, When Steel Talks, the podcast "Concert Honesty," and featured on Pan Magazine's social media accounts. Passionate about the steel pan and music of the West African diaspora, Ms. Duncan performed with the PCS Nitrogen Silver Stars Steel Orchestra in the 2016 Panorama finals competition in Trinidad, visited the Mangrove Steelband in London in 2019, and has also twice studied samba drumming and Brazilian culture in Rio de Janeiro and Salvador, Bahia. Ms. Duncan received her bachelors and masters degrees in percussion performance from the Bob Cole Conservatory of Music at CSULB and Northern Illinois University, respectively.



DAVID TEHERO TECHNICAL DIRECTOR

Mr. David Tehero comes to us with 13 years of experience working in the industry. He has worked for a multitude of theatre companies such as 3DT, Musical Theatre West and Staged Cinema Productions to name a few. With a portfolio of live shows, musicals and trade shows, he brings a new perspective to our ever-evolving art form. This is not his first appearance here at SMCHS. He has been invited as master carpenter since the fall of 2019 and is proud to accept the mantle of technical director in our TAPA program.

AMY LUSKEY-BARTH TALON THEATRE PRODUCER AND ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

Mrs. Amy Luskey-Barth holds a Master of Pastoral Counseling from Trinity College of Graduate Studies and a Bachelor of Fine Arts in Drama from USC. A veteran theatre director and teacher whose career spans over thirty years in educational theatre, Mrs. Luskey-Barth founded Tri-School Theatre for Servite, Connelly and Rosary high schools and served as producing artistic director from 1989-2004. Since 2010, Mrs. Luskey-Barth has served as artistic director of Talon Theatre at Santa Margarita Catholic High School. She is the sponsor of Thespian Troupe #5524 and has taken students to the California State Thespian Festival, the International Thespian

Festival, the California Youth in Theatre Day in Sacramento and the International School Theatre Association ISTA festival in Terezin, Czech Republic and Atlanta, Georgia at the Center for Civil and Human Rights. Mrs. Luskey-Barth is director of Project Speak UP! and executive director of Theatre on Purpose. Her productions have garnered multiple MACY and Cappies awards over the years. Mrs. Luskey-Barth served three years as the California state advocate for the arts for the Educational Theatre Association and is currently a member of the California State Board of the International Thespian Society. She was the recipient of the University of Notre Dame Great Teacher Award in 1996 and was named one of the top 25 teachers in Orange County by Parenting OC Magazine in 2015. She developed the Playworks Program for emerging young playwrights for the California State Thespians. She has taught memoir writing for the North Orange County Community College District Continuing Education Program and Cuesta College Community Programs. Mrs. Luskey-Barth has mentored and coached students for some of the premier college theatre programs and conservatories around the country. Her students have attended NYU, University of Michigan, University of Southern California, UCLA, DePaul, Chapman, Marymount Manhattan, UCI, The Atlantic Theatre Company, University of Redlands, Boston Conservatory and the American Academy of Dramatic Arts.



ARIELLE KALINA DIRECTOR OF DANCE

Ms. Arielle Kalina serves as the director of dance at SMCHS where she teaches beginning through advanced level dance classes and International Baccalaureate Dance, as well as directing the dance team. She began dancing at the age of 6 and has trained in the styles of jazz, lyrical, tap, ballet, and hip hop throughout the course of her dance career. Ms. Kalina earned her Bachelor of Arts in Dance at California State University, Long Beach where she studied jazz, ballet, and modern under various professional dancers and choreographers. While studying at CSULB she performed, as well as choreographed, for various shows within the dance department. Ms.

Kalina was also a member of the Long Beach State Dance Team, where she competed at a national level. In 2010, she was selected to perform with the Black Eyed Peas at the Kids Choice Awards. After graduating.

Ms. Kalina was a member of the Pace Elite International Competition Team, with whom she is a two-time Dance World Champion. Before teaching at SMCHS, Ms. Kalina taught and choreographed for numerous dance studios and high schools in Southern California. She has judged for multiple dance competitions both nationally and internationally. Ms. Kalina looks forward to sharing her passion and love for dance with her students daily. It is important to her to not only teach her students the art form but to help them grow into hard working, independent and creative adults.



DANIELLE DARWAZEH SONG HEAD COACH AND DANCE TEACHER

Mrs. Danielle Darwazeh has over 25 years of experience coaching, teaching and choreographing dance. She started dancing at the age of 3 and has been professionally trained in various styles including ballet, tap, jazz, hip hop, pom/song, theater, character, modern, pointe and lyrical. At the age of 13, she was chosen as a member of the Tremaine Teen Dance Company and trained with world renowned choreographers in the dance/entertainment industry. She had the opportunity to dance for various live events, videos, TV, and films, such as "Austin Powers: The International Man of Mystery," WB Dubba commercial, Miss Christy's Dancin' videos and The Royal

Danish Ballet. Mrs. Darwzeh also has experience working behind the scenes in the dance/entertainment industry. She worked for MSA Agency, one of the top dance/choreography talent agencies in Hollywood. Their clients' work can be seen everywhere from film, TV to the stage. Some of the projects she worked on included, "So You Think You Can Dance," "Dancing With the Stars," and the High School Musical franchise, just to name a few. Mrs. Darwazeh is a graduate from UC Irvine and was the captain of their dance team for three years. She was a member of the United Spirit Association where she served as a head instructor and a member of their program development staff. She currently judges for various event companies when she is not with her teams competing. Mrs. Darwazeh has coached, choreographed and taught for numerous schools and dance teams throughout the United States including high school, college, semi-pro, and pro teams, including the LA Laker Girls, 49er Gold Rush Cheerleaders, San Diego Charger Girls and OC Gladiators. During the past 20 years of teaching/coaching, her teams have won numerous national titles and awards including Innovative Choreography, Technical Excellence, Superior Showmanship, Best in Category, Grand Champions and the Bronze Medal at USASF's Dance Worlds. She loves sharing her passion for dance and her competitive spirit to motivate and push her dancers to be the best they can be. Mrs. Darwazeh takes pride in her dancers and dedicates herself fully by investing in each of her dancers' growth and development.



CASEY GARRITANO THEATRE TEACHER AND CHOREOGRAPHER

As a former member of Actors Equity, Mr. Casey Garritano has performed in professional regional theaters and touring companies since the age of 12. He started his teaching career at Orange County School of the Arts in 2004 after receiving his Bachelor of Arts in Theatre from UCLA with an emphasis in Musical Theatre. He has been working at SMCHS since 2014 and is currently serving as a full-time theatre arts teacher, dance instructor for the school's TAPA Conservatory, Cappies critics advisor and ComedySportz coach. SMCHS choreography credits include "You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown," "Into the Woods," "West Side Story" (MACY Award, Best

Choreographer), "Godspell," "Fiddler on the Roof," "Hello Dolly" (MACY Award, Best Choreographer) and "Guys and Dolls." Mr. Garritano's other choreography credits include "Crazy for You" (OCSA), "Oklahoma!" (OCSA), "How To Eat Like A Child" (OCSA), "The Robber Bride Groom" (OCSA), "Anything Goes" (OCSA), "The Boyfriend (OCSA), High School Musical (Wilson High School) and Bye Bye Birdie (Wilson High School). Some professional choreography credits: "The Producers" (Tibbies Center Stage) and "Swing Into Spring" (Encore Dinner Theater). Some regional performing credits include: Cosmo in "Singin' in the Rain" (Candlelight Pavilion, Performance Riverside), Will Parker in "Oklahoma!" (Welk Resort, Downey Civic Light Opera), Tommy Djilas in "The Music Man" (Merry-Go-Round, Playhouse, NY) and Dancer in "Mozarts Idomeneo" (LA Opera).





WHEN STUDENTS SPEAK UP, ARE YOU LISTENING

Speak UP![®] is an original award-winning play written and performed by students for students that gives voice to some of the most troubling issues facing young people today. The often taboo-topics of sexual assault, harassment, identity, and suicide are brought to life in a powerful 25-minute presentation that serves as a catalyst for conversation.

Speak UP! first launched as an SMCHS IB Theatre collaborative project in 2016. Written and originally performed by Raiya Browning '18, Hannah Billups '18, Hannah Loessberg '18 and Griffin Webb '18 with branding and graphics by John Luke Polson '18, the play encourages empathy, compassion, and love serving as a powerful reminder of how inextricably linked we are to one another.

- PROJECT Speak UP! educates and empowers young people by providing easily accessible on-ramps within the school setting to speak up about their mental and emotional health needs.

- PROJECT Speak UP! is an educational tool that includes resources, surveys, and protocols for post-performance talk backs with parents, counselors, campus ministry, faculty, staff and administration.
- PROJECT Speak UP! has been adopted and incorporated into the sophomore curriculum by the SMCHS Mental Health Task Force.
- PROJECT Speak UP! ambassadors are trained in their junior and senior year by mental health professionals.
- PROJECT Speak UP! is available free
 of charge as a tool to foster mental health
 services in the school setting.
