### <u>Planning</u>

The Office of International Programs contacted the CCG to host a "Friendsgiving" during International Education Week. This event would allow international students to experience many of the traditional American foods served at Thanksgiving, and because of the CCG's successful 2020 winter meal program, OIP and the CCG were prepared to host the event. Friendsgiving would take place during the CCG's weekly "Doghouse" drop-in hours in order to increase awareness of the CCG's new programming. Because of limited capacity in Austin Auditorium and general unsureness of how successful the event would be, only international students and their guests would be able to attend the inaugural Friendsgiving.

Countertop ovens were borrowed from the Chemistry department to reheat casseroles, and these were set up in the CCG space. Tablecloths, to-go boxes, and other serving supplies were borrowed from the CCG's inventory. OIP organized turkey, cranberry sauce, dressing, green beans, dinner rolls, and drinks were catered by Chartwells, the on-campus dining provider. Casseroles and desert that were donated included sweet potato casserole, homemade dressing and stuffing, pineapple casseroles, chocolate pie, pecan pie, and much more.

#### The Event

Students were welcome to drop in at the event anytime between 5 and 7. OIP organized Thanksgiving trivia during the event and created a "Wall of Gratitude" that students could contribute to by adding what they are thankful for this year. The Wall of Gratitude was available all week for any students that wished to add. Overall, the event was a huge success! Over 35 international students and guests attended Friendsgiving, and the CCG and OIP are hopeful that Friendsgiving can grow into an annual event, bringing international and domestic students together through this American holiday.
