1 The possession and/or use of illegal drugs and the misuse of prescription drugs is prohibited. The

2 distribution, abuse, or misuse of over-the-counter medications or other chemicals or substances is

3 likewise prohibited. Students shall be notified in writing at the beginning of each school year, or at the

4 time of enrollment, that they shall be subject to testing for drugs and alcohol during the school year.<sup>1</sup>

5 The Board shall pay costs of any testing required pursuant to this policy.<sup>2</sup>

# 6 **REASONABLE SUSPICION DRUG TESTING**

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Principals are authorized to order drug tests for individual students when there is a reasonable cause to
 believe that:<sup>3</sup>

- 9 1. A school board policy on alcohol and drug use has been violated;
- 12 2. A search of lockers has produced evidence of the presence of drugs and/or alcohol;
- 13 3. A search of persons and containers has produced evidence of a presence of drug and/or alcohol;
- 15 4. A search of vehicles has produced evidence of the presence of drugs and/or alcohol; or
- 16
  17 5. Through observation or other reasonable information reported by a teacher, staff member, or
  18 other student, a student is using and/or under the influence of drugs and/or alcohol on school
  19 property.
- Prior to performing a drug test on a student based on reasonable suspicion, the following conditionsmust be met:
- 22 1. A particular student has violated school policy;
- 24
  2. The test will yield evidence of the violation of school policy or will establish that a student
  either was impaired due to drug use or did not use drugs;
- The test is in pursuit of legitimate interests of the school in maintaining order, discipline, safety, supervision, and education of students;
- 4. The test is not conducted for the sole purpose of discovering evidence to be used in a criminal
   prosecution; and

- 5. Tests shall be conducted in the presence of a witness. *Person who shall act as witness shall be the Coordinated School Health Coordinator.*
- 3 Upon receiving reasonable information, the principal shall take the following steps:
- 4 1. Call the student into the principal's office or another private place;
- 6 2. Summon an appropriate qualified witness;
- 8 3. Discuss with the student the basis for the determination that a test is necessary;
- 4. Inform the student of the procedures which shall be followed in administering the test;
- 12 5. Notify the parent/guardian of the student of the impending test; and
- 6. Give the student an opportunity to decline the test and inform the student that refusal to submit to drug testing will be handled the same manner as a positive drug testing result.

# 16 REASONABLE SUSPICION DRUG TESTING PROCESS

The appropriately qualified and trained witness shall take the student to a designated place in the school and collect a specimen from the student. The specimen shall be taken in a manner which will ensure the integrity, validity, and accuracy of the test results but are minimally intrusive and provide maximum privacy to the tested student.

21 The type of specimen taken shall depend on the substance in question, and the test performed on the

specimen shall be appropriate for accurate detection of the substance in question. Once taken, the

23 principal shall give the specimen an identifying number which in no way will reveal the identity of the

24 student.

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25 The principal shall forward the specimen for analysis to a laboratory accredited by the Tennessee

26 Department of Health and Environment and designated by the Board. Specimens shall be retained for

- 27 ten (10) days.<sup>6</sup>
- Upon receiving a written, certified copy of the analysis from the laboratory, the principal shall do one
   of the following:<sup>7</sup>
- If the results of the analysis are negative, they shall be reported as negative, and all evidence of
   the individual test, including all records in the school that the test was ordered and the reasons
   therefore, shall be destroyed and expunged.
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- If the results of the analysis are positive, the student and parent(s)/guardian(s) shall be given the
   written notice of the result. All records of the test, request for a test, or indication a student has
   been tested shall be confidential student records in accordance with state law.

The Director of Schools will develop procedures to ensure that those students testing positive receive
 the assistance needed.<sup>8</sup>

#### DRUG TESTING FOR STUDENTS ATTENDING MARYVILLE ACADEMY<sup>4</sup> 1

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An optional and elective drug testing program shall be provided for students attending Maryville 3

4 Academy for zero tolerance offenses. Parent(s)/guardian(s) will be given the option to sign a voluntary

consent, based on need, for drug testing for their child upon enrollment to Maryville Academy. The 5

Director of Schools shall develop procedures for the Maryville Academy Drug Testing Program. 6

#### **RANDOM DRUG TESTING OF STUDENTS PARTICIPATING IN EXTRACURRICULAR** 7 **ACTIVITIES**<sup>4</sup> 8

- 9 Maryville City Schools considers participation in TSSAA-sanctioned athletics, participation in school
- sponsored cheerleading, and receiving a permit to park on school grounds as a privilege, not a right. 10
- Students enrolled in grades 9-12 who participate in these activities are expected to accept the 11
- responsibilities which accompany the privileges, among these is the responsibility to remain drug free. 12
- Randomly throughout the year, students enrolled in grades 9-12 who participate in TSSAA-sanctioned 13

athletics, participate in school sponsored cheerleading, and receive a parking permit will be subject to 14

15 drug testing for illegal or banned substances.

16 Parent(s)/guardian(s) and students shall be informed of this policy prior to participation and shall sign

- a consent to the drug testing and a release of information as a condition of participation. 17
- No student who tests positive under a random drug testing program shall be suspended or expelled 18
- from school solely as the result of the positive test.<sup>5</sup> The Director of Schools shall develop procedures 19
- for the Random Drug Testing Program. 20

#### PENALTIES 21

Malicious use of authority granted by this policy by any school personnel may be grounds for 22 dismissal.9 23
