Our Lady of Good Counsel Catholic School, established in 1957, is a parish preschool, elementary and middle school with approximately 500 students. The Virginia Catholic Education Association (VCEA) has accredited OLGC School since 1972. OLGC School is also a member of the National Catholic Education Association (NCEA) and has been awarded U.S. Department of Education Blue Ribbon School status.

The School provides a Catholic education instilled with the spirituality of St. Francis de Sales. It is intended to "make your child's faith a living, conscious, and active one through the light of instruction." The integration of religious truth and values with life is the focal point of the curriculum. As part of its educational program, OLGC School strives for academic excellence, encourages appreciation of the fine arts, fosters self-respect and respect for all life, and attempts to develop responsibility for the total community.

There are 18 classrooms, a computer lab, science lab, multi media center, music room, band room, art room, academic support center, foreign language room, math rooms, gymnasium, cafeteria, elementary playground, preschool playground, and playing fields. OLGC students have access to the following technology: the school-wide network, the Internet, desktop and laptop computers, iPad tablets, LCD and document projectors, wireless access, and interactive whiteboards. All middle school students are issued an iPad with keyboard or Chromebook for home and classroom use.

# Parish Finance & Pastoral Councils

The Finance Council is established according to Canon 537 of the Code of Canon Law with the purpose to aid the Pastor in the administration of parish goods and to advise him in financial matters. The Finance Council shall recommend policies, approaches, and procedures relating to the financial management of Our Lady of Good Counsel Parish; will review the annual budget, the diocesan annual report, and the annual report to the parish; shall support the Pastor by providing assistance to the Pastoral Council and parish committees and organizations related to financial planning, budgeting, and operations; will assist with developing and implementing a plan for the overall capital maintenance of parish facilities, and is advisory to the Pastor. In accord with Canon Law, the Pastor will make the final decisions with respect to all spiritual and temporal matters in the parish. CAREGIVER STRESS: MORE TIPS FOR TAKING CARE OF

**YOURSELF** – Continuing from last week, here are some additional ways to help manage caregiving stress: Join a support group. This can provide validation and encouragement as well as problem-solving strategies for difficult situations. People in these groups understand what you're going through. It can be a good place to create meaningful relationships. The Shepherd's Center of Northern Virginia has an excellent ongoing group. Seek social support. Make an effort to stay well-connected with family and friends who can offer nonjudgmental emotional support. Set aside time each week for connecting, even if it's just a walk with a friend. Set personal goals. For example, set goals to establish a good sleep routine, find time to be physically active on most days of the week, eat a healthy diet, and drink plenty of water. Many caregivers have issues with sleeping. Not getting quality sleep over a long period of time can cause health issues. If you have trouble getting a good night's sleep, talk to your doctor.

<u>Respite care.</u> It may be hard to imagine your loved one in someone else's care, but taking a break can be one of the best things you do for yourself, as well as the person you're caring for. Most communities have some type of respite care available such as in-home respite, adult care centers and programs, and short-term nursing homes. Nearly 60% of caregivers work outside of the home. If you're one of them and you're a caregiver, you may begin to feel overwhelmed. If you do, think about taking leave from your job for a period of time. Employees covered under the federal Family and Medical Leave Act may be able to take up to 12 weeks of unpaid leave a year to are for relatives.

Remember, you're not alone. If you're like many caregivers, you have a hard time asking for help. Unfortunately, this attitude can lead to feeling isolated, frustrated, and even depressed. Rather than struggling on your own, take advantage of local resources for caregivers. To get started, contact the Fairfax County Area Agency on Aging to learn about services in our community, 703-324-5411. I hope these articles have been helpful to those of you, heroes and heroines all, who are caregivers for a beloved family member.
