English

This term in English the pupils will be studying the text Street Child. While exploring this fantastic text, the pupils will be able to empathise with the characters while discovering what life would have been like for different groups of people during the Victorian times. The pupils will be exploring the text through characterisations and letters, as well as investigating how descriptive settings have an impact on the reader. They will then use this to create their own exciting story opener.

Maths

To begin the term, the pupils will be developing their knowledge of equivalent fractions as well as applying this to a range of reasoning and problem solving activities. We will then move on to recognising and converting between mixed number and improper fractions. We will conclude the term by multiplying fractions by whole numbers as well as converting decimals to fractions.

Wider Curriculum Focus—History

Why did Britain once rule the largest empire the world has ever seen?

Pupils will learn about how influential Britain really was, the geography of the British Empire and the factors that contributed to the decline of the British Empire. Pupils will then assess the Commonwealth's significance in the world today, which many former colonies joined after achieving independence from Britain. We will also look at Queen Victoria as an important historical figure and her impact on the Empire.

Art

The pupils will be studying William Morris, and building upon their existing knowledge by comparing his work with other artists of the same era. They will experiment with a range of different mediums to develop and enhance their skills, looking at different textures before moving onto printing. Taking inspiration from the work of William Morris, the pupils will design and make a printing block in order to create a wallpaper sample.

Science

Our topic is animals including humans where pupils will be exploring changes animals and humans face through life.

Computing

This term in Computing the pupils will be learning to code where they will learn to predict;, run, investigate, modify and make codes.

Music

The children will be listening to and appraising 'Make You Feel My Love' by Adele (and other similar music). The children will be learning to sing the song and play part of the song on glockenspiel before composing part of the song themselves.
