Welcome back to you, our parents, carers and community of learners.

We wish you all a very Happy New Year and do hope that your Christmas break was an enjoyable time for you and your family. We all lament at the speed with which it passes!

However, with a new year comes heart-felt resolutions and the desire to improve from the past and move forward to achieve what may have been previously unattainable. We, at the academy, are all back on track to achieve our goals and targets for this academic year, in spite of the constant presence of the pandemic and negative news about current living.

We are all in this moment, together and together we will stronger and work to overcome obstacles and maintain a healthy status quo, for all.

Before we had even started the new term, Mr Sadler and his beyond fabulous team of staffing volunteers (we thank them profusely) had arranged for a smooth lateral flow testing day, for all our students from whom consent had been gained, on Tuesday, 4th January. This took our staff away from their training and preparation for their start of the term, for they know that supporting a safe environment for our students and staff and engaging with the DFE recommendations, ensures a better chance of a healthier start to the new academic term for all who work in the academy.

The Omicron and Delta variants are still within our community and we know that they spread within schools, therefore, we are working within government guidelines and are reinforcing with our parents, carers and students that unless medically exempt, face coverings form part of the uniform expectations throughout the school day (bar when outside) until further advised. The DFE have stated they will make us aware regarding a change in this requirement at the end of January, therefore, we can only and repeatedly urge you to ensure you provide your child with sufficient face covering to last a day and beyond.

The academy is running out on a daily basis as we provide numerous face coverings throughout the day to those who do not enter the academy wearing one or whose covering gets lost or damaged.

As you can imagine, it is incredibly wearing for our staff to have to spend time reminding students to wear the covering over their nose and mouth and not under their chin, or in their pocket. This government directive is to protect the community and I do ask that you support the academy to keep everyone safe by ensuring your child brings in and wears a face covering whilst in the building.

Whilst we maintain as best we can our safe working practices, we focus, too, on our students' learning and no more so than our Year 11s who started their GCSE Mock Examinations, this week. Thanks go to Mr Wilson who leads our examination invigilators and ensure, as he does each year, that all exams are sat with an eye for detail and fully in line with JCQ inspectorate guidelines.

This is such a key time for our Year 11s and their staff and even if the results are not as some students may have wished for, there is still time yet, to improve through a last push with hard work, dedication and also a great deal of support from home. This is a very challenging time for our eldest students as they realise that the countdown to their last year is now ticking, but before that comes the public examinations and the culmination of many years of hard work. If you have any concerns about the progress of your Year 11 child, do contact their subject teacher and of course, their form tutor and pastoral team will support with any welfare concerns, but most importantly of all, keep the lines of communication open with the academy. We wish our Year 11s the best of luck and thank them for their mature approach to this important time of their last year. As soon as the results are published, Mr Sadler, who leads our Key Stage 4 students, will make you aware.

Personal Development Update

In our first week back, Year 7s have begun looking at different forms of relationships, first of all friendships: what are the signs of a positive friendship and how to overcome difficulties that may occur.

Year 8 have begun their term looking at all forms of discrimination by examining what we mean by discrimination and stereotyping people.

Respectful relationships are also the theme of this term for Year 9 who have had their first lesson on family life.

Post 16 options and career choices will be looked at by Year 10 as they look at the large range of choices they have to continue their education after their GCSEs.

Year 11 will be developing their communication skills, firstly with learning how to be assertive rather than passive without being aggressive. This is a key skill that they can continue to develop into adulthood.


Self-Isolation Guidance

Following amendments to the self-isolation rules, we would like to share the information we have received from the Department for Education with you.

The guidance now states that:

Individuals may now take LFD tests on day 6 and day 7 of their self-isolation period. Those who receive two negative test results are no longer required to complete 10 full days of self-isolation. The first test must be taken no earlier than day 6 of the self-isolation period and tests must be taken 24 hours apart.

If both these test results are negative, and you do not have a high temperature, you may end your self-isolation after the second negative test result and return to your education or childcare setting on day 7.


All students that raise/donate any amount of money will receive an official Race for Life medal.

We look forward to seeing how much money we can raise as a school community, for such a great cause. Good Luck to all the students and enjoy!


How to pay:

Step 1: Visit https://fundraise.cancerresearchuk.org/page/the-hastings-academy


Step 2: When you click the link, you will be taken to this page


Rapid Lateral Flow Testing


Reporting student absence (01424 711950 option 2) or via email below
