My name is Lauren Postl, and I am a current sophomore at Divine Child. I started Feed the Hungry Club during February of 2021. It took a lot of coordination and communication between teachers and nonprofit organizations, not to mention the added challenge of COVID-19, to get the club started.

One of my favorite hobbies is volunteering. I truly believe that volunteering can have a huge impact on someone's life. By starting this club, I wanted to make volunteering opportunities more accessible to students in the hope that it would ignite in them a passion for making a difference.

Hunger is a huge problem, but I do think that it can be solved starting with small solutions. I have a passion for helping the hungry and homeless, and I wanted to share that passion with others in order to have a bigger impact.



As of now, the club has done two "Baking for PBJ Outreach" projects. We baked batches of granola, as well as peanut butter cookies and chocolate chip cookies, that were distributed to 200 men and women through PBJ Outreach, a local nonprofit organization that distributes food and other essentials to the homeless in Detroit. For future projects, we are planning on trips to Gleaners and Forgotten Harvest, a food drive for Ronald McDonald House. The biggest project we hope to do this year is a food packaging event through Kids Coalition Against Hunger. This event would produce 10,000 packages of dried food for countries around the world. To reach this goal, we will fundraise throughout the year to collect the resources needed for the project.

Congratulations to the 2021 Robo Falcons, our FIRST Robotics team #8179 on winning the prestigious, FIRST Robotics Rookie Game Changer Award!

>> The FIRST Robotics Competition (FRC) is an international high school robotics competition. Each year, teams of high school students, coaches, and mentors work during a six-week period to build and program a robot capable of competing in that year's game. A robot completes tasks such as scoring balls into goals, placing inner tubes onto racks, hanging on bars, and balancing on balance beams. The game changes annually, and while teams are given a kit of a standard set of parts during the annual kickoff, the teams are also allowed and encouraged to design, buy and/or make specialized parts via CAD tools and camera technologies to make their robot more capable and a stronger competitor.

In the Robo Falcons second season of FIRST Robotics competition in 2021, the students optimized the capability of last year's robot to compete in a series of at-home challenges (due to pandemic restrictions). Our robot was able to maneuver an obstacle course, shoot balls at a target, and even drive itself autonomously! The students also had to participate in a remote presentation, fielding interview questions from the panel of judges. As a result of the team's effort in physically constructing, programming, testing, and driving our robot, and presenting our results, the Robo Falcons won the FIRST Rookie Game Changer award for 2021!

BOYS' SOCCER had a successful season in 2021. The team finished with a 9-6-4 final record and finished second in the Catholic League AA division final standings with a 3-2-4 league record. The Varsity soccer team captured its third straight District Championship, its fifth in six years. The JV team won the league championship with only one loss on the season. For the first time in school history, Divine Child tied and defeated Cranbrook. The Falcons will return many key players for a strong 2022 season!

GIRLS' SWIM - Who knew Falcons could swim? With victories over town rivals Edsel Ford and Fordson, the team was led by captains Julie Sweikowsky, Payton Markavich, and Abby Jernigan. They finished 6th at the Catholic League Championship meet at Waterford Kettering High School. Senior Payton Markavich was the team's high point scorer with 10th place finish in the 50 free and 7th place in the 100 Breaststroke.

BOYS' TENNIS was filled with new players and a new assistant coach, Angelo Fileccia, but that didn't stop us from competing with a lot of great teams. This season we had 6 first year players in the lineup at DC. Some of them were playing competitively for the first time. All of our players this year improved tremendously and we now have a strong group of boys returning next year. We finished the year 500 and with a 2nd place finish at the Catholic League tournament. Next season we're expecting to have an even better year with many of our players having gained a lot of great experience this year. The 2022 season can't come quickly enough. Go Falcons!!

GIRLS' GOLF topped off their incredible season by winning the Division II State Championship. It was the first time in school history that the Girls Golf team had won a State Championship title. This followed up their impressive victory at the State Regionals which they won by 46 strokes. It was the second year in a row that the Falcons won their State Regional. One week prior to the State Regional, the Falcons won their third Catholic League Championship in a row at the Detroit Golf Club. They also finished in a three way tie for first place in their Catholic League division with a 5 -1 record. Overall, it was a season to remember for the Lady Falcons.

GIRLS' LACROSSE had an amazing season in their first official year as an MHSAA team after their season was canceled last year. The team went 15-3 on the entire season. The team was led by a strong group of five seniors but of the nineteen girls on the roster only two had ever played at the varsity level. They were first seed for the Catholic League tournament and went all the way to the finals. The girls ended their season making it to the regional semifinals. Looking forward to another great season this spring.

BOYS' BASKETBALL finished the season 11-3, district champs for the 4th year in a row, but this was the first district championship at the Division 1 level in school history. Defeating Dearborn in the District Final 66-53, but lost to River Rouge in the regional semifinal to end the season. Season MVP was Senior Guard Andrew Iaquaniello `21. Also graduated three other 3 Year Varsity players in Kyle O'Connor `21, Grant Reising `21, and Jacob Marchykwa `21. Highlights of the season were wins at Detroit Renaissance and finishing 5-1 in the AA Catholic League Division with two wins over rival Detroit Loyola (61-56 at Home, 67-59 at Loyola in OT.)

BOYS' WRESTLING had a great season. Numbers in the program improved from 6 to 14 athletes and DC wrestling was finally able to field a team rather than just a group of individuals. The team was led by senior captains Marco Thomson `21 and Matthew Ejakov `21 who truly embodied everything that the new DC Wrestling program stands for. These seniors helped the younger wrestlers understand the importance of hard work and dedication to their crafts. We had a successful season, but like some other sports our season ended early due to COVID. We had 6 wrestlers with winning records and won a few dual meets as well! The new captains this season, Jaime Ibarra and Isaiah Ploucha, will continue to invoke these values into the younger athletes on the team.

BOYS' BASEBALL team had a rollercoaster ride in 2021, but was thankful to be back on the diamond. After not having a season in 2020, the 2021 campaign was eventful and featured a district championship. Unfortunately, the season ended in the regional with a hard-fought 2-1 defeat to Trenton. For the season, the team was led on the field by 2B Adam Kuczajda `21, C Derek Marinucci `21, OF Ethan Munro `21, Clifton Scalf `21, and P Grant Reising `21. Coming back for the Falcons in the 2022 season will be P Owen Avery '22, OF Carson Sampson '22 and 1B/P Jack Zang '22.

GIRLS' BASKETBALL had a challenging 2020-21 season that taught character-building, as they spent more time shut down or in quarantine then they did on the court. They finished in 3rd place in the Central Division and only were able to play 10 games total ending with a 7-3 overall record. Even through the struggles of the season, the team worked very hard and made great strides. Individual honors include: All Catholic sophomore Kennedy Blair, All













League junior Ashley Hill and senior **Amber Traub** `**21** and All Academic senior **Shea McCormick** `**21**.

BOYS' LACROSSE season was a memorable one particularly since the 2020 season was canceled due to the pandemic. Both JV and Varsity teams have a lot to build upon from this past year. The Varsity team went 13-6 overall, finished second place in the CHSL AA division with a 5-1 record and won a State playoff game before losing in the Regional semifinals. There is a lot of enthusiasm for the upcoming 2022 campaign as the team continues to grow their program.

BOYS' GOLF was excited to participate this year after having the 2020 season canceled. The program welcomed new Varsity Head Coach and DCHS Theology teacher Jason Jackett to the family as well as Bob Salter as the JV Head Coach. Ben Loiselle **`92** returned to the program as Varsity Assistant Coach. Despite being a young team in a transition and rebuilding year, the boys represented DCHS with integrity and honor both on and off the course. The Varsity team competed in 6 matches and 12 invitationals gaining much experience and finished the season strong shooting a season best 367 and placing 6th at Regionals. The boys and girls golf programs ended their seasons on a successful and fun note by hosting a golf camp for 26 fourth through eighth graders from the local community at Lakes of Taylor. Our goal for the season is to qualify for the State Tournament by placing in the top three at Regionals.

GIRLS' BOWLING finished second overall in regular season play and would eventually fall to Farmington Hills Mercy in the Catholic League Final. In Regional play the girls would finish 4th and just ten pins out of qualifying for the State Tournament. This is a young group of girls that has been getting better each and every year. Amidst incredibly strict COVID-19 restrictions and guidelines, the team began their season virtually. They meet daily online, doing at home work-outs and choreography all through Zoom calls. Once the girls were able to meet in person, it was only without contact with other teammates, so where in previous years coaches could aid in an athlete's progress in tumbling or stunting, that was quickly halted and the athletes were further held back. With a lot of determination, prayer and heart, the Falcons reached the Regional level of the State Tournament where they put out an incredible performance.

GIRLS' TENNIS looks to improve on its third place finishes in Catholic Leagues and Regionals last year. They are led by Captains Alessandra Senatore, Sarah Collins, Helen Jakubowicz and Mia Hammer. With a strong supporting staff of seniors Jenna Fawaz, Abbie Jernagan, Avery McKelvey, Gabby Pizzino, Julie Sweikowsky combined with returning varsity members Anna Arao, Aly Barrette, Riley Cash, Kylar Hansen and Tia Shuayto the Falcons have much more depth in both doubles and singles flights.

GIRLS' SOFTBALL had a wild 2021 season dealing with COVID. The majority of the team consisted of 3 seniors, 2 Juniors, 6 sophomores, and 2 freshmen. However because of the lost season of 2020 only one senior had any varsity experience. It was a roller coaster of a season battling quarantines and close contact restrictions. GIRLS' SOCCER TEAM TAKES CHSL CHAMPIONSHIP

The 2021 varsity girls soccer team had a truly historic season this past spring--in addition to winning a third consecutive MHSAA District Championship, the team also won its first ever MHSAA Regional Championship, defeating a talented South Lyon East team 3-2 via shootout in the Regional Championship game. In addition to goals in regulation from sophomore Sydney Bourdon and senior Taylor Meadows '21, goals in the penalty shootout were scored by Meadows, junior Anna Bidolli '22, and senior Amber Traub '21. This Regional Final was truly one of the most important and memorable games in the program's history! Equally as impressive as the team's play and success during the MHSAA state tournament was its performance during the Catholic High School League's (CHSL) regular season and playoff. The Falcons were able to qualify for the CHSL (Bishop Division) postseason tournament for the third consecutive year. In the CHSL semifinal, DC was faced with the task of playing Warren Regina on the road, against whom the Falcons had dropped two one goal games earlier in the season. After falling behind 1-0, the team played an outstanding second half. Senior Morgan Stack '21 scored all three Falcon goals, and the team advanced to the program's first ever CHSL final appearance with a 3-1 victory.

In the CHSL Final, DC met Farmington Hills Mercy, a team who the Falcons split with in the CHSL regular season. The championship game delivered outstanding performances from both teams, and the Falcons captured a 3-2 victory. Junior forward Mia Thomson found the back of the net twice, while junior Ashtyn Lange assisted on multiple goals. Additionally, defenders **Shea McCormick '21, Kristina Persichetti '21,** Lyndsey Aho '22, **Gabby Chabala '21**, and Avery Haynes '22 worked to anchor the DC back line. The Falcons' CHSL Bishop Division title was the first league championship in program history!

The Falcons finished the season with an overall record of 16-5. An impressive 15 players from the 2021 roster were named to the MIHSSCA All-District team, while 8 were named to the All-Region team. We've raised over \$430,000

What started as a deep concern about the mental and physical wellbeing of our students as they transitioned to a post-quarantine school experience, stimulated a quest to create a better, all access fitness facility for our Falcons.

In April 2021, we began an aggressive four month fundraising campaign for the Falcon Fitness Center. Through the unwavering and never doubted support of our Falcon community, we raised \$270,000 for the first phase of our project. Our alumni stepped up to donate \$133,000 of that, and the Alumni Association matched up to \$100,000!

Despite delays in production and shipping of our equipment and weights, the fitness center is almost complete. Many future Falcons, their parents, and some of our alumni were able to walk through the space at our November 7th Open House. It received rave reviews! Students were invigorated and excited to begin working out in the space. We will host a grand opening for all our gracious contributors after the first of the year!

Once we got started, the creative ideas were flowing and we saw an opportunity to revitalize the gym, athletic hallway and atrium spaces to match the caliber of the fitness center. As the most trafficked space of our school, the atrium and athletic hallways are often the first impression of Divine Child High School. By adding an interactive touch screen, branded signage, wall wraps and branded floor runners, we can create a space that lets visitors know who we are as Falcons! To date, we have also raised \$163,000 for phase two and can begin work on the project as soon as school is out this spring.

There's no doubt about it. Aidan Hutchinson '18 has become a household name for Big Ten football fans across the country!

Now in his senior year at the University of Michigan, Aidan was recently recognized with the prestigious Vince Lombardi Award. This honor is presented to the offensive or defensive lineman or linebacker who in addition to showing outstanding performance and ability on the field, best exemplifies the character and discipline of NFL Hall of Fame coach Vince Lombardi.

Aidan is Michigan's first Lombardi winner since LaMarr Woodley in 2006. Hutchinson set the single-season sack record this year with 14, breaking the record of 12 held by Woodley and David Bowens.

" ... I can't break any of those records without my teammates doing their jobs on every single one of those plays," Aidan shared during his acceptance speech. "I couldn't be more grateful for them and proud they're doing their jobs and I'm receiving the fruits from it."

Aidan's knockout season reached a high point when Michigan took down Ohio State with a 42-27 win for the first time since 2011, and Aidan demolished the competition with three of his team's four sacks that led to a Wolverine win.

Michigan went on to defeat Iowa in a 42-3 blowout at the Big Ten Football Championship, at which Aidan was recognized as the Grange-Griffin Big Ten Championship Game MVP — the conference's first defensive player to receive the honors. Hutchinson finished the game with four total tackles, a sack, and two quarterback hurries.

In addition to these accolades, Aidan was named the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year, Big Ten Defensive Lineman of the Year, and runner- up for the esteemed Heisman Trophy which was awarded on Saturday, Dec. 13, 2021. He currently is ranked as the NFL's No. 1 draft pick.

During his time at Divine Child High School, Aidan was well-liked by his classmates and teachers, and known around campus as a kind, talented and motivated young man.

"It was exciting to have him in my class when he was being heavily recruited by Michigan, especially as an alumna," said **Michelle (Whalen) Sugg `88**, one of Aidan's DCHS English teachers. "I always watched Michigan football, but his presence on the field has made it that much more special to be a fan. It was a surprise and an honor when he called out **Gina Delgado '00** - one of his Spanish teachers - and I as his favorite teachers. It meant more than he will ever know. He deserves all the accolades and we are so proud of him!" On the field, Aidan's athletic skill and sportsmanship shone bright throughout high school. "[Aidan is] easily the most competitive, and confident, studentathlete I have ever worked with," said the DCHS football program's defensive coordinator **Matt Moore '04**. "Whether he was competing for a regional final on the football field, or playing ultimate frisbee in gym class, he was going to want his team to win."



Aidan is the son of Chris Hutchinson, a 1992 Michigan captain and All-American defensive lineman, and DCHS alumna **Melissa (Sinkevics) Hutchinson '90**. His sisters **Mia Hutchinson '14** and **Aria Hutchinson '17** are also alumnae.

One of the biggest needs was for a water purification system so that water would no longer need to be boiled prior to consumption. Through the very generous

donations of Mr. Patrick Murphy and others at Divine Child, the system was supplied.

These students attend school twelve months per year. Many families simply cannot afford the tuition as the average yearly salary in Ghana is a mere \$1200. Many students in attendance are being sponsored through donations that the Society of the Infant Jesus receives.

His latest invention, the Valkyrie Thoracic Fixation System is a radiolucent sternal plating system that offers clinically proven bioactive hydroxyapatite treated screws in conjunction with a PEEK (polyether-ether-ketone) plating material used to close the chest after open heart surgery. The system's bioactive screws generate faster bone growth and their double lead thread pitch makes insertion easier and quicker.

Previously he invented the Thorecon Rigid Fixation System for anterior chest wall reconstruction and he co-created Tritium SCP, a metal plating system used for the sternum. His inventions have been implanted during surgery treating infants to elderly adults.

Currently Pete is the Managing Director of Cardiothoracic at Able Medical Devices located in the Upper Peninsula of Michigan. He has been with the company since March 2019.
