THE SCHEDULING PROCESS

STEP 2: Teacher Recommendations

- In the next few weeks, your teachers will complete recommendations about which classes you should take next year in English, Math, Social Studies, Science and World Languages.
- Bring your course request sheet to your core teachers (English, Math, Science, Social Studies, and World Language) to discuss course recommendations for you.



THE SCHEDULING PROCESS

STEP 3: Parent/Guardian Conversation

- Take home your course request handout and have an additional scheduling conversation with your parents/guardians. Then together, fill in your Final Student Request.

STEP 4: The Scheduling Conference

- Every student will meet with a school counselor for a brief, individual, scheduling conference.
- Students must bring their **COMPLETED** “Student Request Sheet” with all requests filled in.



THE SCHEDULING PROCESS

STEP 5: Course Request Verification

- All schedule corrections, changes, and adjustments **MUST** be completed by *March 4, 2022!*
- As a reminder, the sooner a concern is addressed, the more likely that a suitable solution will be available.



PERFORM ARTS AUDITIONS

What if I want to take a course that requires an audition (like choir, band, or orchestra)?

- Place the course on the Schedule Request sheet
- Talk with the specific teacher about when the auditions will take place.
