Mentoring Program

Students in grades 5-12 meet twice per month with an assigned teacher, administrator, or staff member to set and review goals, ensure progress, and encourage the success of the students through the new mentoring program.





Measurement of Academic Progress

Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) is a computer adaptive assessment taken by students in grades K-10 in the fall, winter, and spring for math, reading, and language. Teachers use the growth and achievement data to develop instructional strategies to personalize learning for every student.

The gift that | How our community changed **keeps on giving:** | the lives of one Liberty family

There are two main components to change. The first: how it's handled is relative, fluctuating from person to person due to a myriad of variables. The second is universally the same for everyone: it's inevitable. For the Glover family, more specifically Jackie and Allen, change, through discovering and getting plugged into the Liberty Christian community, has rendered their lives nearly unrecognizable (in a good way!) from just 10 years ago.



Both were building successful careers, she in real estate and he in the auto industry, while traveling the world with no intentions of starting a family.

"Then," as Jackie says, "God whispered."

Enter their two children: Jack, now a second grader, who is a prayerful, sweet soul and good friend to all, who loves nachos, football, and movies (in that order); and Kori, a spunky, energetic, and downright wild preschooler whose joyfulness is contagious. Climbing the corporate ladder and seeing the sights weren't a top priority anymore. That shifted to their children. And in the process, the passions and priorities for Jackie and Allen changed – volunteering and giving have become core family attributes.

"If you want to be close to God, He's here [at Liberty Christian]. God is the heart of the community at LCS," Jackie said. "He's in the smiles of the staff; He is in the little voices that sing His praises; in the relationships that begin on campus. God is everywhere in this school."

When the Glover parents first came to Liberty Christian, they "immediately" felt God's presence.

The thing about change, though, is it can often be accompanied by apprehension. In the Glover's case, that came in the form of a "bundle of nerves" on Jack's first day of preschool.

That bundle of nerves, however, quickly dissipated when Jack's teacher and the Primary School principal prayed with the Glovers in the hallway outside of Jack's classroom.

"That meant the world to us," Jackie said.

They haven't looked back ever since. Now their lives revolve around church, their children, and charities
by giving financially and volunteering at Liberty Christian and other organizations, such as God Cares School Uganda, The Salvation Army, and Just Because, Inc., to name a few.

Why the change of heart to volunteer?

"I just wanted a friend," Jackie said. "We were new to LCS and in the midst of praying for Jack to make a friend, I realized I needed one, too. It was a purely selfish act that's led to some of the greatest friends I could ever hope to have and it's just proof that God is in the details."

Volunteering and giving, once seen as inviting unknown change into their lives, are now a staple in the Glover household. They give because it fills their cup, they believe in Liberty Christian's mission and core values, but most importantly, because the act glorifies God, as Colossians 3:17 says. "And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father."

Jackie says giving has been life changing, altering their family's perspective "in the most profound way." Leading by example for her children is the motivation behind her servant's heart (Matthew 5:16). And the results have been abundantly fruitful, she says.

"Giving to LCS has the greatest return of any investment you'll ever make," she said. "Every gift, be it time or money, contributes to the overall success of your child."

Being part of the Liberty Christian community that is focused on furthering the Kingdom of Christ is powerful, Jackie says, and joyful as well. Knowing that volunteering and giving make a difference in the lives of faculty and students is a blessing.

"God is at the center of every pursuit," Jackie said. "In a world of so much uncertainty, LCS is encouraging and equipping our children to become principled leaders who stand firm on the teachings of Christ."

6th and 7th grade retreats were a huge success! Amazing memories were made on the 6th grade trip to Glen Lake Camp. This retreat was all about being welcomed into the jungle of Middle School. Through games, lessons, and team bonding, this retreat is designed for 6th graders to enter into Middle School with confidence.

7th graders went to Sky Ranch for a retreat called Kardia. The focus of this retreat was on relationships with God, parents, friends, technology, and dating. Multiple sessions and discussion groups were held to dive deep into what God made us for. There was also an epic guys versus girls competition throughout the retreat, which the girls won!

Middle and Upper School Chapel is focusing on the book of John this year and specifically asking the questions, "Who is Jesus?" and "What does He want from me?" Local youth pastors are coming in to speak throughout the year with the hope and prayer that students will recognize the person of Jesus Christ, develop a desire to follow Him, and become plugged into a local church.

7th and 8th grade students were matched up with 11th and 12th grade leaders who have completed Leadership Academy to become **Impact Leaders**. These students meet together every other week during school to have meaningful discussions and build relationships that will encourage Middle School students to seek after the Lord and live life well.

11th and 12th grade Impact Leaders went on a retreat in Broken Bow, Okla., with the Spiritual Life Team before the school year started. The purpose of the trip was to **have fun and create community**, while having intentional sessions to equip the leaders as they prepared to pour into Middle School students during the school year.

Youth Pastors Courtney Crenshaw and Taylor Morgan have jumped into the classroom to co-teach their dream elective – **Discipleship!** They are loving the opportunity to develop a culture in their classroom of vulnerability, accountability, and community. The class recently completed a unit on Spiritual Disciplines!

The Spiritual Life Team launched the 2022 Mission Trip and are looking forward to leading Liberty students as they **serve** through hurricane relief work in New Orleans. Within five minutes of launching, there were more than 100 students signed up for the trip!

Seniors kicked off the school year with a retreat at Camp Cho-Yeh! It was a great weekend for community, fun competition, and reminders to **keep their eyes fixed upon Jesus** throughout their senior year. The Spiritual Life Team has kicked off this year's SLT podcast, which will cover multiple topics that will equip and encourage our families to pursue Christ together and build His Kingdom.
