Pingry offers courses at the college-prep, and Honors/Advanced Placement/Advanced Topics levels. Enrollment in Honors, Advanced Placement, and Advanced Topics courses requires departmental approval. The standard academic load is 5 courses and the year is divided into 2 semesters, with some courses yearlong and others a semester or trimester in length.
