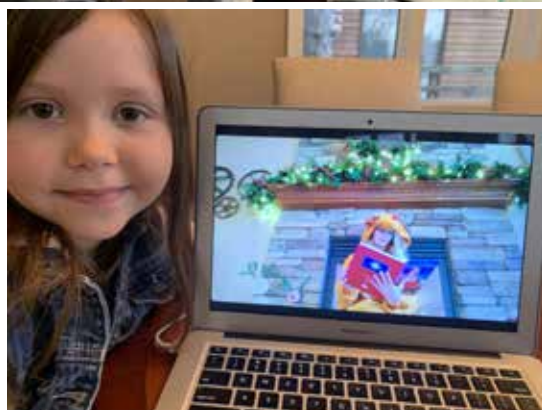
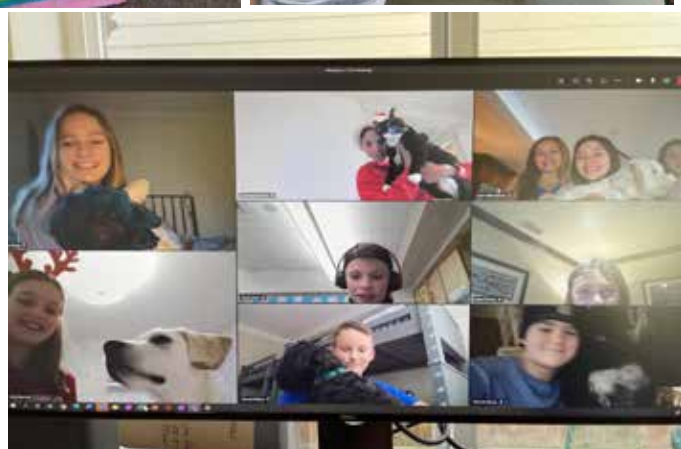

The parish annual report is generally a time to summarize the projects of the past year and to showcase the things that have been achieved. It often touts the renovation of buildings that have been completed, programs that have been introduced, and the amount of people involved in numerous ministries in a parish like Sacred Heart. You would not expect to see a parish annual report entitled, "We survived! Or did we?" You might not think it walking, driving, shopping, or dining in downtown Bellevue, but many among us have had a very difficult time physically, emotionally, mentally, and spiritually. Many have struggled to survive. This is why I am entitling this report, KEEPING THE LIGHT ON FOR YOU!

During the first few months of COVID-19, we began streaming Mass to your homes every weekend, until we could safely open the church doors for one live Sunday Mass. When the weather began to warm up, we moved outside and had Mass in the parking lot. During that summer, I administered the Sacrament of Confirmation to over 100 of our students in four separate outdoor celebrations in the lower parking lot. During that same summer, we streamed seven weddings for family and friends of the Bride and Groom, not only in the United States, but also around the world. It was a disappointing time for many couples to not have their families and friends in attendance, but it was a realization for us at Sacred Heart that, for the first time, we were reaching the wider world with our celebrations. Some who came to visit in recent months, when they felt safer, told me that I looked better in the flesh than I did on Zoom! I also came to that conclusion after seeing myself on Zoom!

A significant expansion came last October when we began celebrating four Masses per weekend, including the new Sunday 5 pm Mass. Our attendance has continued to grow. I began to visit parishioners in their homes with Holy Communion, when they felt safe enough. Hospital visits were more of a challenge while admittance remained greatly restricted. Everyone who is ordained to ministry is formed with the mind and heart of Jesus to go where people are in need, to bring comforting prayer and presence. While so many of you found it very difficult to be unable to come to Mass, we priests felt equally despondent that we could not safely come and visit so many of our people in their hour of need.

The effects of isolation and loneliness were exacerbated by the violence that occurred in the neighborhoods, towns, and cities throughout our country. The Protestant theologian, Karl Barth, once wrote "To clasp one's hands in prayer is the beginning of an uprising against the disorder in the world." In my mind, this is the heart of our annual report for this past year; how we tried to stand as a beacon of light during a very difficult time. It has been said that in the course of history there is a time when humanity is called to shift to a new level of consciousness --a time when we must shed our fear and indifference and give hope to each other. That time is now. There is a time when our hearts need to be awakened to others and their suffering. That time was this past year when people who had previously handled life with relative ease found themselves pushed to the edge of a deep precipice.

From where I stand, this was the most significant work of Sacred Heart Church this past year. We kept the light on for all who found themselves in darkness. It wasn't about fund raising, it was about faith raising. It wasn't about building; it was about supporting. It was about maintaining a connection during isolation. For more Sundays than I care to remember, I celebrated Sunday Mass and spoke a homily to empty pews who showed no response. But every time I stood in front of the camera, I visualized speaking to you, the parishioners of Sacred Heart. I tried, with no props, to speak from my heart to your heart; to speak from Christ in my heart to Christ in your heart, from the light of Christ in my life to the light of Christ in yours.

Thank YOU for making this possible! Between us, we kept the light on at Sacred Heart through one of the most difficult periods of life that any of us have ever experienced.

There is no denying that the past year was challenging. It was a difficult time for students, parents, teachers, and staff (not to mention all the other people in the world around us). I think that many of us had hoped we would be starting the new year without COVID-19. Unfortunately, that was not the case.

But in spite of the challenges, this past year at Sacred Heart School was a time of growth for us all. We certainly learned much about teaching and learning online. The students and staff (and parents, too) quickly learned more about a wide variety of educational tools and apps. We tested the limits of programs like Microsoft Teams. Together, we made online learning work. Then, when the conditions changed, we switched to hybrid learning with some students in person and others at home. Again, the students, teachers, staff, and parents worked together to successfully run hybrid classes. We were able to make these leaps thanks in large part to the support we have received from our community over the last several years. Your support provided the technology and personnel necessary to take our learning online.

In addition to moving learning online, we also moved our community online. This transition was equally challenging and just as crucial to our students, parents, and staff. We moved plays, concerts, the auction, social gatherings, gaming clubs, conferences, open houses, meetings, school Masses, and more online. Even after we were able to return to school in person, some things still remained online. We were thrilled that we were able to hold things like the Jogathon, drive-in movie night, and a school dance in person!

Distancing and masking have not diminished our community. They have only challenged us to find new ways to connect and support one another. Some things, like the opportunity for online parent-teacher conferences, will remain. Others, such as Open House, will move back to being in person this year.

We all learned how important community is to our school and what a wonderful blessing we have in our community. I am very grateful to everyone who patiently labored with us last year to keep our community thriving for the good of our students and adults alike. Your prayers, talents, creativity, hard work, and donations allowed us to succeed in what proved to be the hardest year of school that any of us ever have had to experience thus far.

I am so grateful for this community and all that you did to work together when we all needed each other the most!

## Notes to Financial Statement:

{1} Every year, the parish & school operating funds make a transfer to the parish & school capital funds. This recognizes the need to put aside substantial money for the maintenance & repair needs as good stewards of our facility-related resources. Forgiveness of the PPP (Paycheck Protection Program) is included in this number.

{2} The interest from our parish general savings account with the Archdiocese of Seattle is an important funding source for the parish capital fund and is included here.

{3} 4 in 1 donations includes donations made by parishioners to the 4 in 1 Campaign, the Called to Serve as Christ rebate & miscellaneous revenue.

{4} Costs related to creating the second Pre-K classroom. This provides the school with the opportunity to offer Pre-K to a larger group of students.

{5} Transfers made to pay off the loan for the 4 in 1 Campaign, as well as replenish a portion of savings used on the 4 in 1 project. Payments were made as construction progressed. Upon completion in fiscal year-end 2021, total costs were set against the Parish Capital Fund.

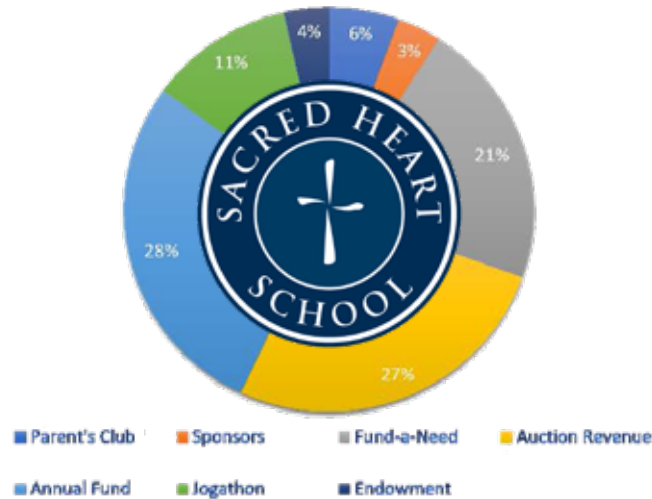
