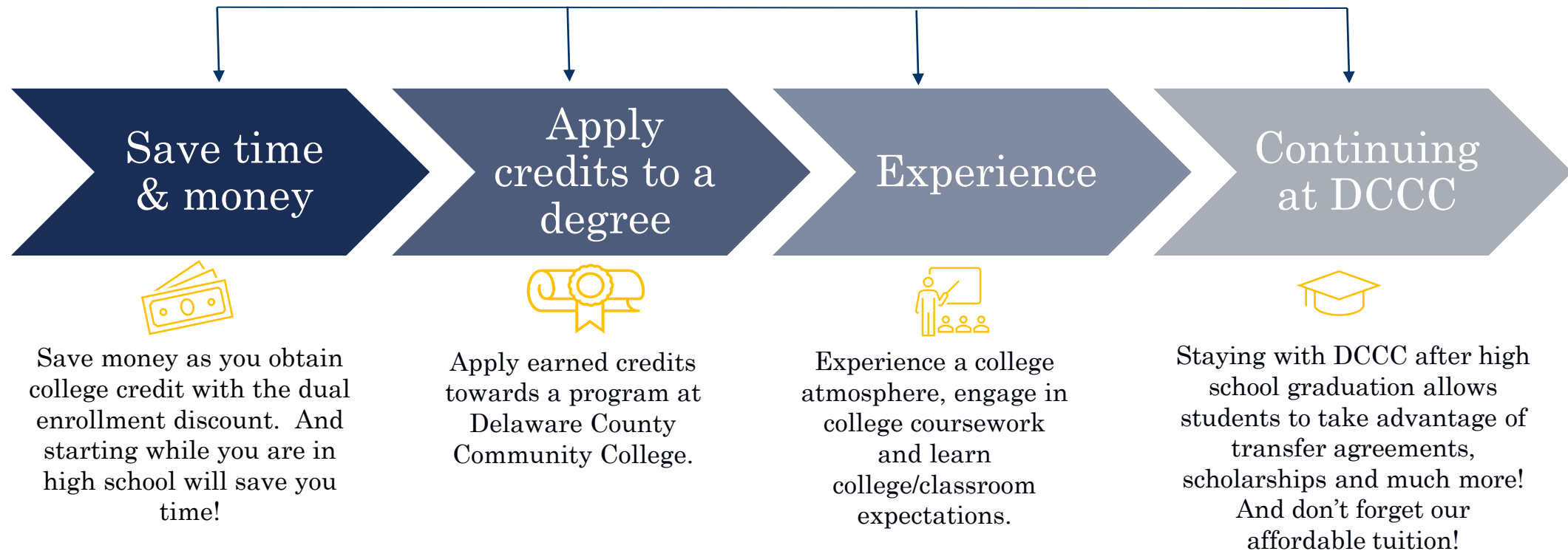

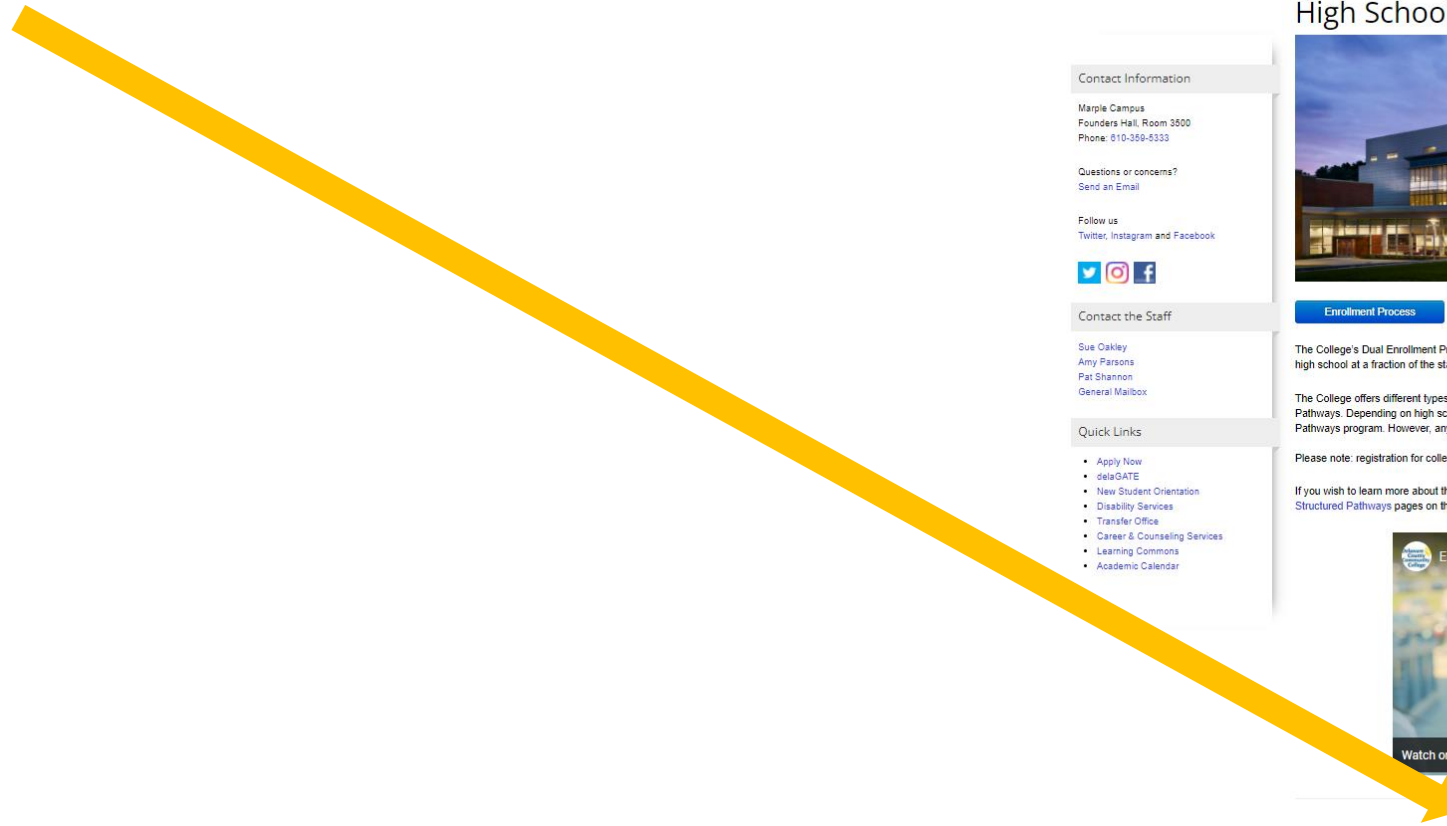
The College's Dual Enrollment Program provides eligible high school students with the opportunity to earn college credit while they are still in high school at a fraction of the standard tuition rates.

Minimum Qualifying Scores for SAT/ACT

SAT Reading/Writing=500; ACT Reading =18

SAT Math = 530; ACT Math = 20

Given COVID-19 new options for placement are PSAT scores or Keystones scores (subject to change).

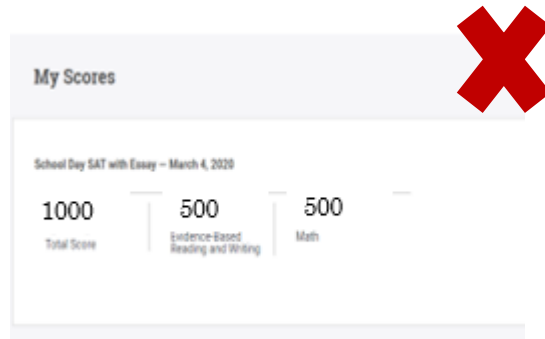

NEXT STEPS

- Submit qualifying scores (upload scores or schedule for the placement test).
 - When submitting qualifying scores, students should submit a document not a “screenshot” from a mobile device or computer.
 - It is best to download a “free” copy of the scores and submit the PDF test score document from the testing accounts (i.e. College Board). Students can submit their document when applying online!

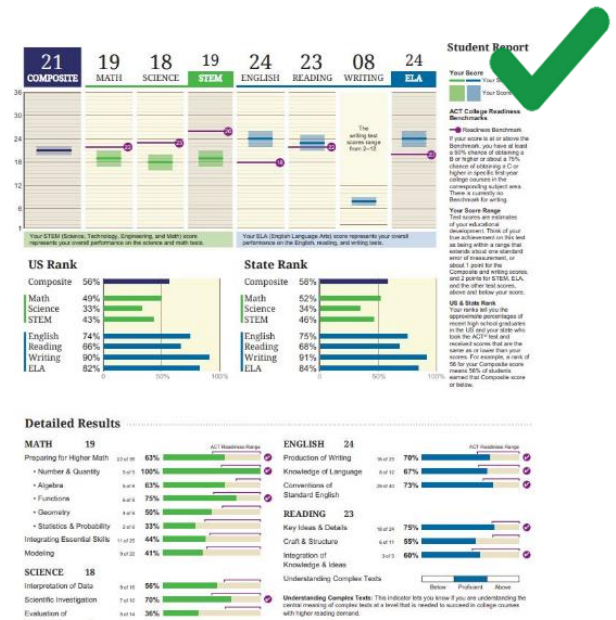

NEXT STEPS

- No qualifying scores? Schedule for a placement test after applying and receiving your DCCC ID#.
 - The placement test may be given remotely.
 - Students will want to obtain college level scores on the placement test. Results will be reviewed with each student.
- If a student has eligible scores, students may register (students will speak with a dual enrollment representative).



Delivery Format & Orientation

Let's take a look at the type of delivery formats.

- Synchronous: online with “face-to-face” interaction.
- Asynchronous: online without scheduled “face-to-face” interaction.
- Hybrid: a combination of online and in-person.
- Traditional: in-person at one of our locations.

Orientation

- New students are required to complete an online orientation.
- Students will have the opportunity to complete the Canvas orientation if enrolling in online courses prior to the semester beginning to ensure they are comfortable and know how to use Canvas.
