SKI TEAMS BEGIN PINE KNOB LEAGUE SCHEDULE

The Notre Dame Girls and Boys Ski teams began their 2021-2022 seasons with a Giant Slalom league meet at Pine Knob. The Girls placed first among 11 competing teams with a team score of 25, picking up head-tohead wins over Clarkston, Cranbrook, and Rochester Adams in the process. Sydney Schulte placed first overall at the meet to lead the Irish while Claire Kirchner (third), Peyton Schindler (ninth), and Amanda Roth (12th) also factored into the scoring effort. The Boys team placed second out of 12 teams with a score of 44.5. Notre Dame dropped its matches to Clarkston and Rochester Adams while picking up a win over Cranbrook. Teegan McLeod took sixth overall at the meet with Frank Roth (tied for ninth), Nick Uhazie (14th), and CJ Studt (15th) also contributing to the scoring.

Notre Dame was in control of the game from start to finish, led by outstanding play on both ends by senior Brian Lopez. Lopez scored eight of his 10 points in the first quarter, which helped the Irish take an 11-7 lead that they would not relinquish. Lopez and Jacob Tuttle played stellar defense on the Falcons' key player, which slowed Rochester's offense down all night long. The Irish took an 11 point lead into half time and never took their foot off the gas, building up a 20 point lead in the third quarter. The Irish were led in scoring by Sophomore Wade Robinson with 19 points, followed by Senior Jack Olis with 11.
