PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND HEALTH To fulfill graduation requirements, students need two credits of Physical Education and one credit of Health. Students should complete these before their junior year.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION: 1	Physical Education: 1 can be completed by taking Physical Education during the school year or by taking Physical Education in Summer Academy. Physical Education: 1 is one semester long.
PHYSICAL EDUCATION: 2	Physical Education: 2 can be completed by taking Physical Education during the school year, by taking Physical Education in Summer Academy, by taking Dance History and Appreciation during the school year, by taking Advanced Dance History and Appreciation during the school year, or by playing a varsity HCS sport and completing the accompanying Physical Education packet. Physical Education: 2 is one semester long.
HEALTH	Health can be completed by taking Health during the school year or by taking Health in Summer Academy. Health is one semester long.

ELECTIVES Choose up to five electives that you would like to take next year. Prioritize your choices by writing numbers to the left of the course title (with 1 being your first choice). Do not choose any electives that you would not be willing to take. Elective offerings can and will change based on the number of requests.

Note: All electives are year-long classes unless otherwise indicated.
