**PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND HEALTH** To fulfill graduation requirements, students need two credits of Physical Education and one credit of Health. Students should complete these <u>before</u> their junior year.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION: 1	Physical Education: 1 can be completed by taking Physical Education during the school year or by taking Physical Education in Summer Academy. Physical Education: 1 is one semester long.
PHYSICAL EDUCATION: 2	Physical Education: 2 can be completed by taking Physical Education during the school year, by taking Physical Education in Summer Academy, by taking Dance History and Appreciation during the school year, by taking Advanced Dance History and Appreciation during the school year, or by playing a varsity HCS sport and completing the accompanying Physical Education packet. Physical Education: 2 is one semester long.
