Weather-Related Updates: Indoor Lunch / Dressing in Layers

Hello, Rockwell Families,

Greetings from campus, and happy Friday! I hope this message finds you well and bundled up in our December weather. We are definitely well on our way to the winter season, and I have a few updates to share to that end.

Our Students Will Be Eating Lunch Inside Through Break and Upon our Return in the New Year

In consideration of our lower temperatures and increased precipitation, our students will eat inside our gym and music rooms through winter break and upon our return in January. Our Beagles will continue to have assigned seating, and we are extending distance between students to the greatest extent possible. Students in the gym will be seated three feet apart in their row, and each row is spaced six feet apart, minimizing close contacts. The students are doing a great job with their new routine, and we are monitoring lunch closely to ensure that everyone stays in their assigned spots until they are dismissed for recess. Thanks all, and please reach out if you have any questions.

Please Dress in Layers over the Next Few Months

As part of our safety considerations and planning, the dampers in our five HVAC system are fully open, allowing for a steady stream of fresh, clean air. The good news: this means our classrooms receive completely new air on average seven times per hour. The challenging part: this also means our classrooms may be colder than usual. I am monitoring temperatures and HVAC operations regularly throughout the day, and in general, we are in good shape, however we have had some chilly days in parts of our campus. Please have your students dress in layers throughout these winter months, and please remind them to bring extra masks in case they need to change them out throughout the day.

Thank you, everyone, and welcome to the last week of school for 2021! It has been a memorable year for sure, and I think this next week is going to pass in a blink of an eye. Enjoy your weekend, and I look forward to seeing you on Monday.

Equity Team Update – Intersectional

Hello from the Rockwell Equity team!

What is Intersectionality and why is it important?

Intersectionality is a term used to refer to the ways multiple forms of inequality in social systems compound when they overlap. It helps us to have a lens to understand why someone who is a part of multiple identity groups may be more disadvantaged. For example, an older black woman who needs a wheelchair may face oppressive roadblocks related to

sexism, racism, ableism and ageism all at the same time. It is important to ask how intersectionality impacts marginalized groups as we consider how we best support them.

Consider how you see elements of sexism, racism, classism, ableism, gender and ethnic bias in your own life and with those around you. Discuss with your family and friends how intersectionality impacts our education, healthcare and work environments.

LWSD Updates

Fall Smarter Balanced Assessment scores available through Skyward/Family Access

Students in 4th-9th and 11th grades recently took the Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA) in English language arts and math. Students in 6th, 9th and 12th grade took the Washington State Comprehensive Assessment of Science (WCAS). The primary purpose of these tests was a brief check-in on how students are doing compared to some of the state standards.

This test was different from prior years' tests in three ways. It was given in the fall instead of last spring, there were fewer questions overall and this test did not assess as many areas as previous tests. For these reasons, we recommend that these fall results not be compared to other year's test results.

The Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) has completed the scoring for these tests and they are now available to school districts. We have uploaded the achievement level and scale score to Skyward/Family Access. Families will receive a more complete graphical report from OSPI in February. Scores for sub-sections of the assessment (such as reading, writing, and math problem solving) are not available for the fall assessment due to the shortened length of the test.

State tests provide a snapshot of how your child performed during testing and are not indicators of classroom performance. Classroom performance should be the primary measure of your child's skills and knowledge. If you have a concern about your child's testing performance, please talk with his/her teacher.

To access the test scores:

- 1. Login to Family Access.
- 2. Select "Test Scores" on the left menu.
- 3. Select "Show Scores" for the assessment.

Skyward Family Access support is available on the LWSD website.

Regular spring state testing will resume in March-June 2022.


