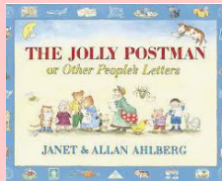
Welcome to another exciting week in year one!

This week, we will continue with our History learning based around WW1 and messenger pigeons. We will be learning how messages were always sent in code. We will try to work out what a message might say by breaking the code. We will create our own messages in code.

English

This week, we will be continuing to read our focus text 'The Jolly Postman'. We will be looking at a supply catalogue sent to the Wicked Witch. We will be choosing items to buy from the catalogue using the conjunction 'because' to explain why we want to buy them.



Maths

This week, we will begin to explore addition to 20. We will be using number lines to add two numbers together with a total of up to 20. We will also look at number bonds to 20.

Science

This week in Science, we will be learning about animals and what they eat. We will be learning about the difference between carnivores, omnivores and herbivores.

Sounds Write

This week, we will continue looking at the extended code.

We will continue to explore the /oo/ sound and the different ways to spell the sound (oo, u, and oul). Please could you practice the following words based on our phonics this week.

Book, full, could, look, bull, would.

Are you eligible for Free School Meals?

Free school meals are available to all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. Free school meals are also available to pupils in receipt of, or whose parents are in receipt of, one or more of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on – paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
