### **KINDERGARTEN**

All 22 elementary schools have full-day Kindergarten staffed with one teacher and one instructional assistant per classroom.


In Kindergarten, students will participate in learning opportunities that help them develop cognitively and academically as well as foster social-emotional learning and motor skill development.



Students learn through play and hands-on experiences. Opportunities for whole and small group learning occur throughout the day.

A student must be 5 years old on or before September 1, 2021 in order to register for Kindergarten.



# LANGUAGE AND LITERACY

- Reciting nursery rhymes, finger plays, or familiar songs
- ✓ Identifying letters /sounds of the alphabet
- Concepts of Print (title, front cover, turn pages, left to right)
- ✓ Rhyming Words
- ✓ Writing letters in first name
- ✓ Retells a simple story/uses picture clues
- ✓ Predicts what happens next in a story
- Speaking clearly enough that others understand
- ✓ Follows two-step directions











### LANGUAGE AND LITERACY




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- Read a sentence and have your child repeat it.
- Take turns reading a sentence each or a page each.
- Talk about the story as you read it. What do you think will happen next? What does this story remind you of? How do you think this character feels? Don't be afraid to read the same book again! Repeated reading helps build reading fluency!



### Check For Understanding

- $\checkmark$  Start the book by making predictions. What do you think will happen in this story?
- ✓ Ask questions and make comments <u>during</u> the reading process.
- ✓ After reading a book, have your child tell you the events from the story in the correct order.
- $\checkmark$  What was the problem in this story?
- $\checkmark$  How did the character feel when ?






# SOCIAL FOUNDATIONS

## SOCIAL FOUNDATIONS-AT HOME ACTIVITIES



Read books about emotions and have conversations about what makes them feel happy, sad, angry. Role Play or use puppets to foster conversations about emotions and practice having conversations. Playing charades and asking them to act out different emotions or mimicking you as you say an emotion and then make a face or body movement to show what that emotions looks like in others.

Participate in community activities with same age peers. Examples: sports teams, dance, community play groups, visit playgrounds or parks

Play different types of games to help with waiting to take turns, focusing on their task or activity, following multi-step directions, solving problems. Fun games are Simon Says, tic-tac-toe, hide and seek, red lightgreen light, memory, Go Fish, and age-appropriate puzzles. Scavenger hunts that have a focus are also fun ways to practice these skills(find something that starts with the first letter of your name, find something that rhymes with, find something red..)

Allow for opportunities for pretend play in different settings. This could be setting up a tent and sleeping bag with camping gear to pretend to camp. You can set up a pretend kitchen with some dishes and different utensils and allow them to pretend to run a restaurant.




# PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT: GROSS AND FINE MOTOR

Drawing with crayons, markers, and pencils




