Form 7 visit Brookwood Cemetery



On arriving at Brookwood, Form 8 heard the tragic diary extracts of World War One soldiers and some of the haunting poems from that war in the impressive American Mausoleum. Then the pupils started visiting the graves to prepare notes to use in our poems on the life of a soldier, which included writing down some of the powerful inscriptions on gravestones. Mr Swan, the former Head of History at Aldro, explained how some family members would choose to be buried in the same grave and about some specific people who helped change the course of history from SAS officers to spies to those who were mysteriously killed when a plane was blown up deliberately. Then we visited some foreign graves, such as Americans, French and North Africans. After that, we joined back together to form a full-year group and had a look at some more recent graves that sadly were as new as 2015. For all the children in form 7, this trip was powerfully educational, but also tremendously sentimental.



Odd Socks Day



Aldro's Anti-Bullying Week started with Odd Socks Day. We were delighted that so many people from our whole school community took the time to wear odd socks to celebrate everyone's individuality and uniqueness. Throughout the rest of the week there were Anti-Bullying assemblies for each bubble, delivered by Mrs McSweeney and Mr Alexander. In these, we asked the children to think about the strategies they could use to challenge and manage unkind behaviour, both in person and online. We continued with our work on challenging bullying behaviour during our PSHE and ICT lessons during the week and, as always, the boys and girls inspired us with some fantastic discussions, which reflect their wisdom, empathy and kindness.



Childrens Business Fair



In an assembly last term pupils were introduced to the concept of 'Children's Business Fairs' by visiting speakers Sam Rogerson and ex Aldro parent Andrea Finnis. The children were invited to independently apply to this nationally run scheme where they would set up their own businesses. There was much interest from our middle school pupils and a total of 11 Aldro pupils and 2 siblings entered their individual business plans.
