During the last few months our department has been very busy, offering numerous athletic and art camps, a teen day camp, and our summer day camp, with a record-breaking 265 campers in attendance. In addition, we have managed and operated three beaches, a boat launch, cared for and prepared 30 acres of parks/athletic facilities, and built an outdoor gaming area that includes two pickle ball courts, a bocce court, several cornhole boards, and checkers/chess table. As we get back into the swing of things with school beginning and all that fall, winter, and spring brings, I don't see us slowing down anytime soon!

There are considerable physical and mental benefits that active parks, open land preservation, and well-rounded recreational opportunities provide, and communities who utilize and promote these have seen steady growth in development and quality of life. Nowhere is that more evident than in Scarborough. We have active and supportive committees, volunteers, and civic organizations, each working to help improve the quality of life in our community. Over the next few months our department is looking forward to planning new programming, discussing upgrades to parks and facilities, and developing long-range plans to help guide our department into the future.

If you have any thoughts or ideas on what you'd like to see happening, our doors are always open to listen to facility improvement requests, ideas for new programming, or thoughts to improve our overall level of service.

Mission Statement

The mission of the 55⁺ Programs is to give all seniors an opportunity to maintain dignity, enrich their quality of living, and actively promote participation in all aspects of community life.

MEMBERSHIP CHANGE

Scarborough Community Services will no longer sell or renew 55⁺ memberships. Any valid memberships will be honored through the end of the Winter/Spring 2018-19 registration period. Memberships that would have been good past that period will be credited for the "missed time" and the credit may be used towards a future program or trip.

As of the Summer 2019 program brochure, registration will be based on residency. Programs and trips will remain open to everyone interested in participating. Scarborough residents will receive early registration priority. Fees on trips and programs will also be restructured based on residency.

Program brochures can still be mailed to individual households for a fee of \$10 per year. This option is open to ALL households, regardless of residency or age. This fee covers the mailing of three annual brochures.

Thank you to all past and present members for your continued support and understanding during this time of transition.

Cancellation and Refund Policy

If you do not cancel by the deadline or do not attend, you will still be expected to pay for the missed meal at the \$8 rate.

Bus Departure Area for 55⁺ Trips

Directions to the parking lot:

- From Route One, enter Municipal Drive (between town hall and the Town & Country Credit Union).
- Take your first right after the credit union.
- The bus will be located in the second parking lot on the right. This is Staff Parking Lot E (just after the chain-link fence).

Door-to-Door Transportation

We offer door-to-door transportation (pick-up at home) to any Scarborough 55⁺ Programs member who does not drive and who would like to participate in our trips or programs. There is a fee of \$2 per person that must be paid to the bus driver for this service at the time of pick-up. Please note the \$2 fee is per person, even if pick-ups are at the same location.

If you are being picked up at home for any trip, please be ready at least one hour in advance of the scheduled trip departure time. This allows our driver adequate time to pick everyone up.

Bus passes are available from our bus driver or at the Community Services Office at Town Hall for \$20. A bus pass will cover 12 trips for the price of 10!

This program enriches the experiences of children as we view the home, school, community, and child care settings as complementary domains that affect children's growth and development. This program offers outside play or indoor physical activities, crafts and special projects, as well as some quiet time. A nutritious snack is provided each day.

We are a non-profit recreational program complying with all the rules for the licensing of child care facilities established by the State of Maine. If you have any questions about the programs offered, please contact the Child Care Administrative Office at 207-730-4170.

REGISTRATION PROCESS

- Registration must be completed in person in the Community Services Office at Town Hall. When you come to register, we will update all of your household and family member information in our system and have you sign a few waivers. All paperwork will print out at the time of registration.
- A non-refundable registration fee of \$100 will be expected upon registration.
- Please be sure to bring the credit or debit card you would like your monthly or bi-monthly payments to be withdrawn from.
- Registrations are accepted on a first-come, firstserved basis. Unless you have been notified that you have been placed on a waiting list, you are guaranteed a spot in the Child Care or Club Teen program.
- Waiting lists for spots will be started and maintained as necessary for each site.
- There is a three business day waiting period if registering any time after the first day of school in September.

PROGRAMS

The Primary School Program (Grades K to 2)

At 4:30 pm more choices are offered, including clubs, table games, arts and crafts, etc. An afternoon snack will be provided daily.

The Club Teen Program (Grades 6 to 8)

PASSPORTS

For your convenience, Scarborough Community Services accepts passport applications on behalf of the U.S. Department of State. U.S. citizens planning international travel may apply for their passports in the Community Services Office located at the Scarborough Municipal Building.



What to Bring to Your Passport Appointment

EVERYONE

Yourself!

Anyone applying for a passport, including newborn babies, must be present for the passport acceptance.

Passport Photos

This service is provided by area businesses. We do not provide this service.

Personal Check for Payment

Must bring at least one check or money order for payment of each application. The acceptance fee (\$35), which is paid separately, may be paid by cash, check, or debit card.

ADULTS

Age 18+ applying for the first time OR previous passport expired over 5 years ago.

Proof of U.S. Citizenship

Certified U.S. birth certificate OR previous U.S. Passport

Photo Identification

Maine driver's license or Maine ID (If you only have an outof-state driver's license, you must bring additional photo ID)

MINORS AGE 16 AND 17

Must apply in person even if they have had a passport before.

One Parent

It is recommended that one parent be present at the appointment to show parental awareness. This can also be done by writing the check for the passport or putting a parent down as the emergency contact on the form.

Proof of U.S. Citizenship

Certified U.S. birth certificate OR previous U.S. Passport. MUST submit previous passport only if it is still valid.

Photo Identification

Maine driver's license or Maine ID (If you only have an outof-state driver's license, you must bring additional photo ID). If minor does not have photo ID, one parent will need to be present at the appointment and provide their photo ID.

MINORS AGE 15 AND UNDER

Must apply in person with BOTH parents even if they have had a passport before.

BOTH Parents

It is REQUIRED that minors apply in person with both parents listed on their birth certificates. If both parents cannot be present, additional documentation must be completed or presented.

Proof of U.S. Citizenship

Certified U.S. birth certificate. MUST ALSO submit previous passport if it is still valid.

Photo Identification

Maine driver's license or Maine ID for each parent.

We recommend completing the passport application prior to stopping into our office for acceptance.
