Policies

Registration Policy

Community Services accepts registrations in person and through our website. We do not accept registrations via the phone or mail. Registration into activities will be allowed only if the account is in good standing. Balance exceptions will be made for activities in which installment payments are permitted or monthly fees are charged, such as child care. Community Services reserves the right to deny registration into an activity pending payment of an outstanding balance and the right to deny continuation in a program if installment payments are not made or are returned due to insufficient funds after an appropriate period. We will not allow continuation in a program when there is a balance.

Non-Resident Fee

Non-residents may register for our programs. An additional \$15 fee will be assessed for most programs. However, some programs may require additional fees. Please see each program for more information.

Early Registration Discount

Community Services works hard to offer the best prices available for our programs. Because our work becomes labor-intensive the week prior to a program start date, we like to encourage residents to register early by offering early discount prices on certain programs. We hope people will appreciate this and take advantage of these lower prices. *However, this discount incentive is a special offer which cannot be extended if those dates have passed. No exceptions.*

Late Registrations

All of our programs require a high level of coordination which includes facility scheduling, staffing, volunteer recruitment, team formation, and the purchasing of supplies. There is a point when a program will be cancelled or modified if there are insufficient registrations.

You will also notice that the majority of our programs have registration deadlines. If there is room in a given activity after a deadline has passed, late registrations may be accepted with an additional \$10 late fee assessed; however, children may not be guaranteed a T-shirt, ball, etc.

Sibling Discount Policy SD

Look for ^{sp} next to activities that may be discounted.

Youth Recreation Programs

Families with **three or more** children registering for the same Community Services-run recreation program may receive a 10% discount off the third child and any additional children from the same family/household. All participants must be registered at the same time to receive this discount. *Sibling discounts will not be applied for online registrations. To receive this discount, you must register in the Community Services Office.*

Child Care

Families with **two or more** children registered for full-time (five days per week) before-school and/or after-school care will receive 10% off the second and/or subsequent child care fees. Discount will be taken off of the lowest child care fee.

Youth Team Request Policy

Community Services understands that one of the best aspects of participating in our programs is the ability to play with friends or have the same coach year after year. However, in an attempt to keep teams balanced, we have instituted the following policy.

In programs such as basketball, fall soccer, and indoor soccer, coach and player requests will be limited to **two requests per participant**. You may request one coach and one player, or you may request two players. Timely <u>registrations</u> allow Community Services the opportunity to balance teams in a fair manner; timely <u>requests</u> also help in this process. However, there are many variables that go into the planning process and, even though we do our best, we cannot guarantee that your choice will be honored.

Refunds, Cancellations, and Changes

Youth and Adult Programs (see 55⁺ refunds below)

- 100% refund: If Community Services cancels the activity.
- **\$15 processing fee**: For any cancellation or change made by applicant.
- No refunds: If an individual does not attend an activity or does not cancel at least seven calendar days prior to the start of an activity.

Health Reasons

If a participant cannot partake in an activity due to medical reasons, a refund will be given if a signed doctor's note is presented to the Community Services staff within the first 48 hours of said injury. If injury occurs and is reported with a doctor's note before the activity begins, no processing fee will be assessed. If a participant attended some classes, the refund will be prorated for the number of days attended.

Multiple-Session Programs

When registering for multiple sessions at once, please keep in mind that combined session dates are all inclusive; therefore, should you choose to cancel once the first session begins, no refund will be given for the remaining sessions.

55⁺ Programs Refunds

100% refund

If Community Services cancels the activity or trip.

No refunds

Wednesday Lunches: If an individual does not attend a lunch or does not cancel by the Monday prior by 2:00 pm, the household will be charged and the balance must be paid in full in order to enroll in future programs

Trips: If an individual cancels a trip or does not attend a trip, no refund will be issued.






Softball Pitching Clinic Grades 2 to 8



Child care registration for the 2014-15 school year begins Monday, April 7, 2014!

School Age Care -- Grades K to 5



The School Age Child Care program is designed to provide children in kindergarten through fifth grade a safe and exciting place to be during their out-of-school hours. Our state-licensed program currently has an enrollment of over 300 students.

The goal of the program is to promote the physical, mental, social, and emotional development of each child by providing high-quality child care. Activities include outside play or indoor physical activity, crafts, science, cooking, special projects, and quiet times. A nutritious snack is provided daily. We view the home, school, community, and child care settings as complementary and interrelated domains that affect children's growth and development. We keep open lines of communication among all of these groups.

Club Teen -- Grades 6 to 8

The Club Teen program provides an opportunity for those in Grades 6 through 8 to work on their homework, gives them the chance to be with their peers after school, and provides the opportunity to play age-related games and activities. An organized activity is offered every day. Club Teen is located in the Middle School Cafeteria and occasionally in the Narragansett Building.

General Information

Locations

Before-school and after-school care programs are conveniently located at each school in town: Pleasant Hill School, Blue Point School, Eight Corners School, Wentworth School, and the Middle School. Child care administrative offices are located in the Scarborough Middle School Narragansett Building during the construction of the new Wentworth School.

Please note that the drop-off location for Grades 3-5 beforeschool care is at the main entrance to Wentworth across from the turf field. <u>Grades 3 and 4 students</u> remain at Wentworth for after-school care. <u>Grade 5 students</u> must check in at the Wentworth Cafeteria and are transported either by foot or by our mini-bus to the Scarborough Middle School.

Hours

Before-school care opens at 7:00 am; after-school care closes at 6:00 pm.

Please Note: Late pickups will be assessed an additional \$1 per minute. Habitual late pickups may result in termination from the child care program.

Extra Days (Snow Days, Teacher Workshop Days, Vacation Camps)

Snow days, teacher workshop days, and vacation camps are held in the Scarborough Middle School Narragansett Building and Middle School Cafeteria. These extra days are included in regular child care fees; however, pre-registration is required and space is limited. *See next page for details.*

Billing and Payments

Child care fees are billed monthly **September through June**. A registration fee (currently \$100 per child) must be paid in full upon registration.

 Monthly Payment -- Paying fees monthly requires a completed EFT form at time of registration. EFT payments will be withdrawn once a month (on the 5th of each month) or bi-monthly (on the 5th and 19th of each month) September through June. Receipts may be viewed online using your user name and password.

Please remember to have the following on hand to complete your EFT form:

- One voided check Name of bank
- Bank routing number Bank account number

Insufficient Funds -- If an EFT transaction is returned due to insufficient funds, a \$25 penalty fee will be added to your account and you will be responsible to pay the outstanding balance, including the \$25, within 48 hours of notification. If there are any further insufficient funds notices, this may result in termination from the child care program entirely.

Cancellations and Changes

A **one-month written notice** must be provided prior to withdrawing your child from the program or making any schedule changes. Without proper notice, child care billing and EFT processing will continue.

Vacation camp days are open to non-child care participants and non-residents. You must register in person in the Community Services Office and pay in full -- no online registration available. *Please see our fees below.*

Need child care coverage on the remaining teacher workshop days? Register with Community Services and we will keep your child busy with active games, arts and crafts, outdoor play, and more. *Participants must bring a lunch daily. We will provide a morning and afternoon snack.*

You must send a copy of a current State of Maine rabies certificate, along with a check payable to the *Town of Scarborough* for the appropriate fee, and we will process the license and return the material to you.

Per state law, any dog license that is re-licensed after January 31 will be subject to a \$15 late fee; a dog re-licensed on or after April 1 will be subject to a \$25 late fee.
