Scarborough Community Services welcomes new and past campers to Summer Day Camp 2018. We are looking forward to providing a safe environment where everyone can make new friends, explore and develop new skills, and simply have lots of fun! Art and gym activities, theme programming, and field trips will take place throughout the summer. You may register for the entire eight-week program or individual weeks. Please register early as space is limited!

REGISTRATION

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Please be prepared to update the following household information in our system: Home, work, and cell phone numbers, email addresses, emergency contacts (besides parents), child's name, birthdate, grade, allergies, medications, doctor and dentist names and phone numbers.
- Registration is open to residents and non-residents. Non-residents will be charged \$15 extra per individual week or \$75 extra for the eight-week program.
- Online registrations close 10 days prior to the program start date to allow us time to generate accurate attendance sheets and plan trips accordingly.
- In-person registrations are accepted throughout the summer as long as space permits.
- Late fees will apply to registrations accepted less than 10 days before the program start date.

8-WEEK PROGRAM Registration began March 12

We offer a 3-day or 5-day camp option for the full 8-week summer program. NEW this year, both payment options -- pay in full and payment plans -- are available through our online system. You will simply answer the required questions, choose to pay in full or set up a payment plan with a valid credit or debit card, and then proceed to checkout. Payment plans will require \$100 deposit (Grades K-5) or \$150 deposit (Grades 6-9). Payment plans will run every Friday from June 22 through August 10. Registration is also available in person in the Community Services Office using a valid debit or credit card, cash, or check. *EFT payment plans will no longer be available*.

INDIVIDUAL WEEKS *Registration begins April 2*

We offer 3-day or 5-day options for eight individual week sduring the summer school break. Registration may be completed online or in the Community Services Office at Town Hall. Full payment is required at the time of registration. *Payment plans are not available for individual weeks.*

IMPORTANT NOTE Field Trips and Possible Schedule Changes

Please remember that our field trip schedules are always subject to change. If a trip gets rescheduled to another week or is cancelled entirely (due to weather or other unforeseen circumstances), we will not be able to issue refunds or transfer the enrollment to the new week. Campers are still welcome to partake in the events for the day, whether they include a new trip or in-house activities.

Summer Day Camp Nutrition Program (Breakfast, Lunch, and Snack)

Brought to you by the Scarborough School Nutrition Program

The Scarborough School Nutrition Program will once again be offering breakfast, lunch, and snack programs to all Kindergarten through 9th grade campers, for your convenience.

For Grades K-5 campers, breakfast will be held in the Wentworth Cafeteria Monday through Friday between 8:30 and 9:00 am. Breakfast will include items such as cereal and milk, bagels and cream cheese, and pancakes with syrup. All breakfasts include milk or juice. Lunch will be held in the Wentworth School Cafeteria Monday through Thursday between 11:00 am and 12:30 pm, with a bag lunch provided on Friday field trips or when the schedule requires. Lunch will include items such as pizza, chicken nuggets, macaroni and cheese, fruit and vegetables, milk or juice, etc. A Sunbutter® (made from sunflower seeds) and jelly sandwich will always be available for campers who do not like the main dish. Afternoon snacks consist of one snack and drink served after lunch.

Grades 6-9 campers will walk to Wentworth on Mondays and Thursdays for breakfast and lunch and will receive a bagged breakfast, lunch, and/or snack daily on trip days.

New Registration Process for Summer 2018

All Scarborough school children will be able to use their school lunch account to purchase lunch and/or other options during the summer. Please complete the registration form (available online or in the Community Services Office) and return to the Scarborough School Nutrition Program by mail (address on the form).

While everyone utilizing the summer nutrition program must complete the registration form for headcount and planning purposes, payment only needs to be included for those families NOT currently enrolled through the school-year nutrition program. If your child does not have an account, you must contact Brenda Franklin at **bfranklin@scarboroughschools.org**. If you DO NOT want your child purchasing food, please have that discussion with them as we will not be monitoring each child's purchases.

Scarborough Community Services Child Care welcomes all Scarborough school-age children to our before- and after-school program. We offer care for children in Kindergarten through Grade 8, all conveniently located in each child's school. Our mission is to promote the physical, mental, social, and emotional development of each child by providing a high-quality child care program. This program enriches the experiences of children as we view the home, school, community, and child care settings as complementary domains that affect children's growth and development. This program offers outside play or indoor physical activities, crafts and special projects, as well as some quiet time. A nutritious snack is provided each day.

We are a non-profit recreational program complying with all the rules for the licensing of child care facilities established by the State of Maine. If you have any questions about the programs offered, please contact the Child Care Administrative Office at 207-730-4170.

2018-19 Child Care Registration Re-Opens April 9

Registration for the 2018-19 before-school and after-school child care programs began March 12 and was based on the new proposed start times set to begin August 2018. However, due to the possibility that these start times would change, we decided to suspend registration as of Friday, March 16, until a decision was made.

As of Monday, March 26, the decision was made on the start times for the 2018-19 school year and times have been adjusted. Those already registered have until April 8 to make their schedule changes based on the new school schedule. At that point, we will know how many spaces at each site are still available. New registrations will need to be completed in person and are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis based on school site availability.

Registration Process for 2018-19

- Registration must be completed in person in the Community Services Office at Town Hall. When you stop by the Community Services Office to register, we will update all of your household and family member information in our system and have you sign a few waivers. All paperwork will print out at the time of registration.
- A non-refundable registration fee of \$100 will be expected upon registration.
- NEW this year, we will no longer be processing EFT forms for payment plans. When you come to register, please be sure to bring the credit or debit card you would like your monthly or bi-monthly payments to be withdrawn from. Only one card is permitted per child (we cannot split one child's fees between two cards).
- Registrations are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis. Unless you have been notified that you have been placed on a waiting list, you are guaranteed a spot in the Child Care or Club Teen program.
- There is a three-day waiting period (business days) if registering any time after the first day of school in September.
- Waiting lists for spots will be started and maintained as necessary for each site. Participants will be notified if they have been placed on a waiting list within one week of registering for the program.

MOSQUITO CONTROL

Dragonfly Nymphs

Year after year, Community Services sells dragonfly nymphs to households interested in combatting mosquitos in a natural and unique way. Nymphs eat mosquito larvae before the mosquitoes hatch and as adults, they catch mosquitoes on the fly. They do not sting or bite humans. 100 nymphs will cover approximately 1-2 acres of standing water. We have 1,500 available this year (sold in packages of 50).
