

#### **WILTSHIRE CLASS**

Earlier this week in Wiltshire class, the class donned their scientist hats and investigated what happened to water in its different states! Part of that meant studying how ice can turn into a liquid through melting, The children were fascinated to learn about different density of liquids and predicted what might happen to an ice cube dropped into oil. To prove their predictions, they poured in some olive oil [most dense] into a jar with some baby oil [less dense] on top. It formed two different layers - wow!

They dropped a coloured ice cube in which sat in the middle layer and melted, dripping downwards The water eventually melted and formed a silvery liquid at the bottom of the jar. The children observed what happened and found it fascinating to watch and learn!











#### YEAR 3

Year 3 have started to explore the world of Ancient Egypt and have spent their first two lessons in Art learning about and looking at Death masks. They have created mood boards with ideas, colours, shapes and patterns that wanted to experiment with, and followed that up this week with the range of designs they wanted to move forward with during this design phase. We aim to have a 3D death mask to show off at the end of this topic, and at this rate, we should have something to be proud of!
